IMPERIAL TRANSPORT SERVICE WAS A VENTURE OF CAPE TOWN BUSINESSMAN JULIUS WEIL WHO LIVED AND DIED IN MAFEKING. AFTER RELIEF OF MAFEKING 17 MAY 1900 HE OBTAINED A TRANSPORT CONTRACT FROM BRITISH MILITARY AUTHORITIES FOR CONVEYANCE OF GOODS FOR THE ARMY TO AND FROM PLACES REMOTE FROM RAIL SERVICES. SERVICE WAS BY OX-WAGON AND THE DRIVERS AND WAGONS WERE HIRED FROM WEIL BY BRITISH GOVERNMENT.
