The Irish Post Office will issue its fourteenth stamp in the Europa series in two values of 28c and 39c on 29th April, 1974.

The Conference of European Postal and Telecommunications Administrations (CEPT) was established at Montreux in Switzerland on the 26th June, 1959. At the present time, CEPT is composed of Administrations representing twenty six countries including Ireland. The essential aims of CEPT are to bring about a closer co-operation among its members as well as to achieve greater liaison in the advancement of the postal and telecommunications services.

The Executive Committee of CEPT has decided to replace, at least for a trial period, the traditional design traditionally used on Europa stamps with a common precise theme. The themes chosen for the next three years are: 1974—Sculpture, 1975—Painting and 1976—Calligraphy.

This year's stamp design features a statue of Edmund Burke, a noted Irish statesman and philosopher of the 18th century. Burke was born in Dublin in 1729 and played a prominent part in many major political issues from 1765 until his death in 1797. The statue is the work of John Henry Foley, the secretary of whose office Burke was in 1774, and can be seen at the entrance to Trinity College, Dublin.

The design is by Peter Wulfer who has designed a number of Irish stamps.
