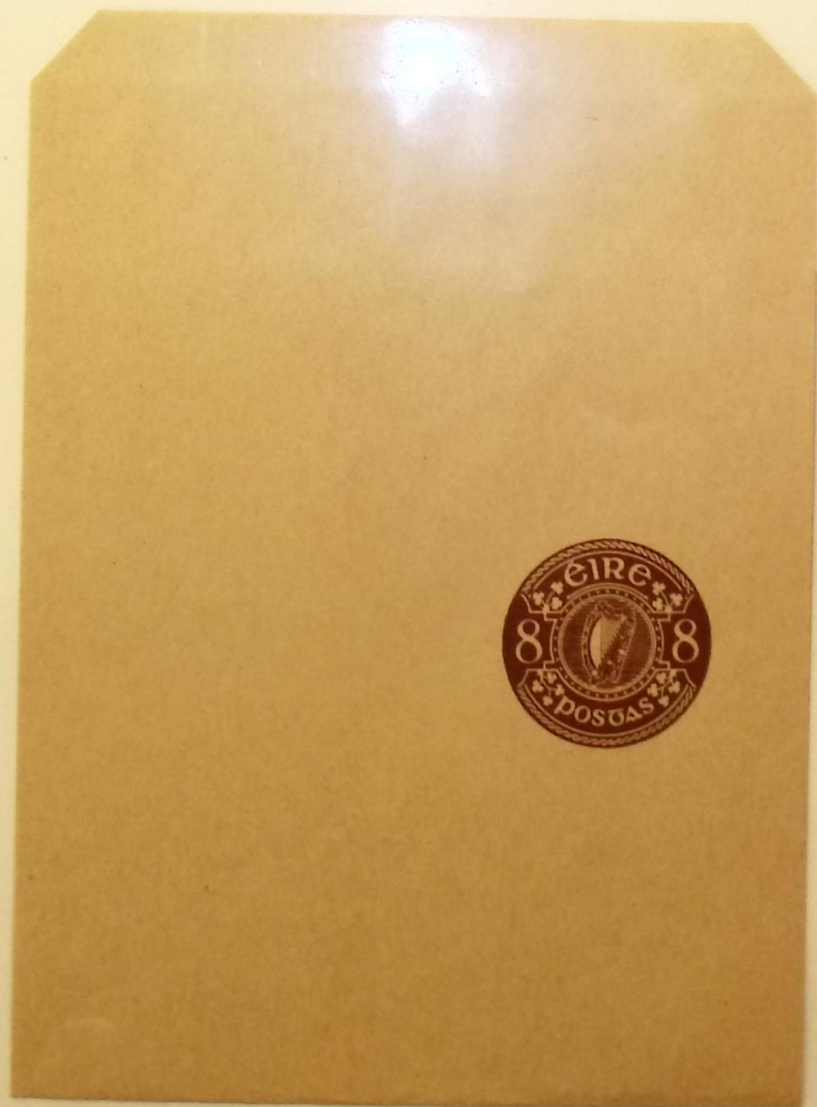

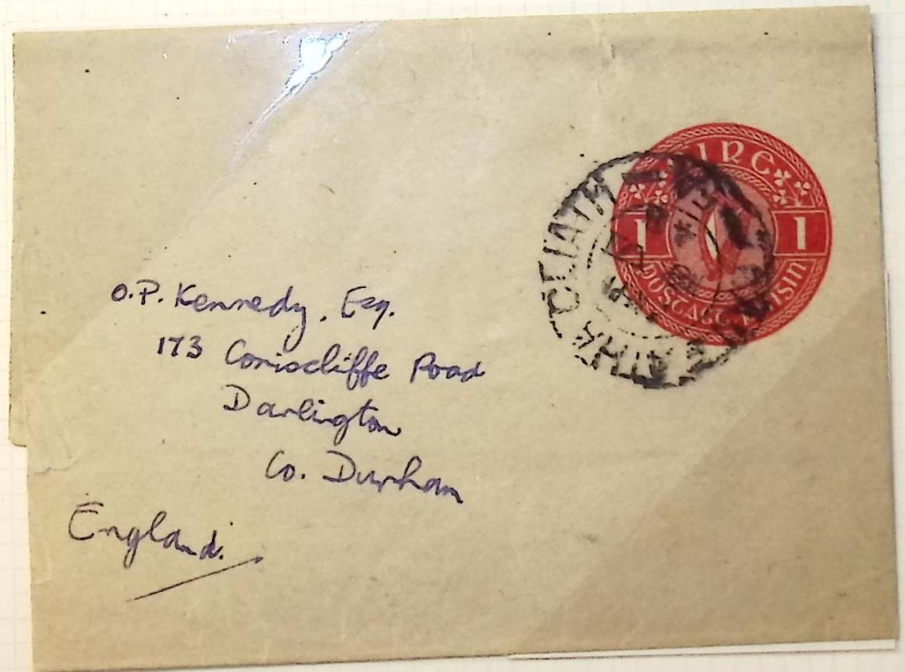

This is the one pence carmine issue of 1924-1925 on pale buff stock. This issue remained unchanged, as did the one-half pence issue, until 1945-1947 when the value was re-issued on heavier stock.

IRELAND

The one pence issue of 1946 appeared on stock termed "whitish". It would better be described as a greyish stock. It was replaced by a 1½ pence wrapper thought to have been issued December 1, 1950, although this one pence value was used on February 24, 1951 without the addition of any postage stamps.

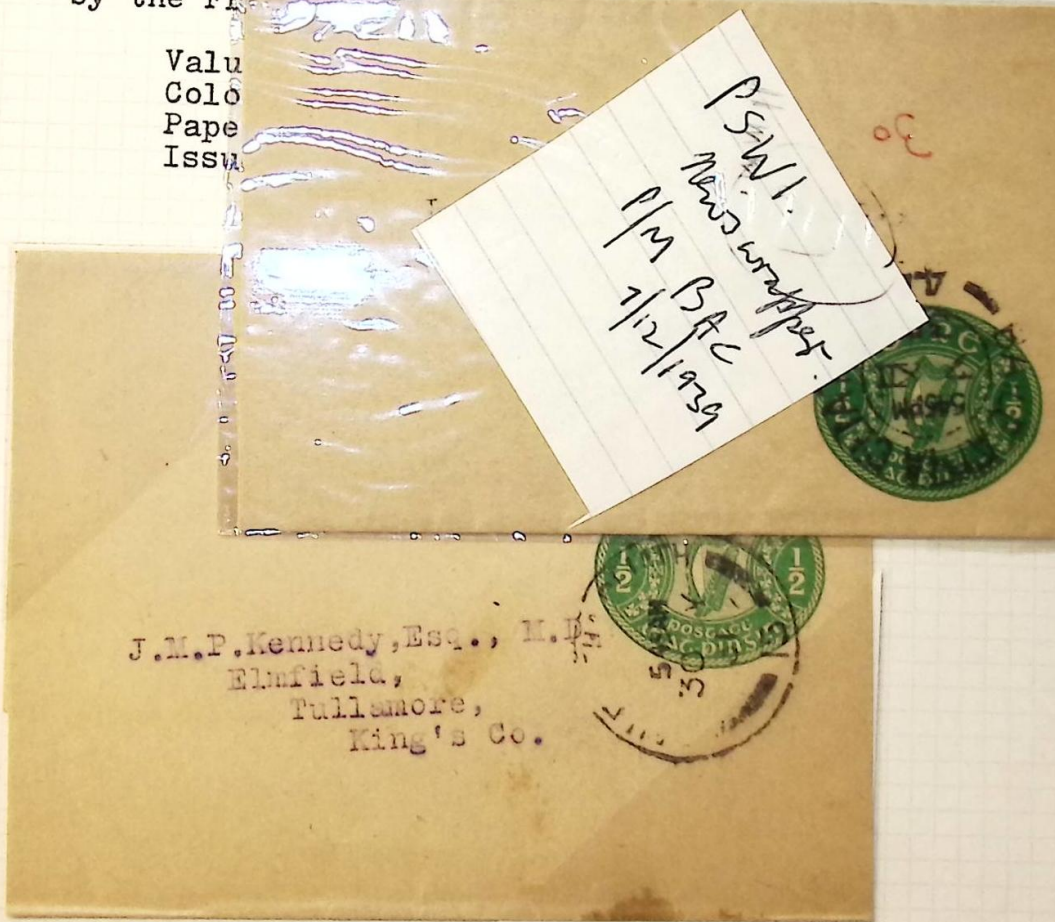

NEWSPAPER WRAPPERS

Newspaper wrappers could be used for any newspaper registered at the General Post Office in either Dublin or London. They could then be transmitted at the special newspaper rate if each item did not exceed 6 ounces in weight. All wrappers are typographed and measure 110 x 275 mm. (except for two varieties issued in 1924-1925 which are 105 x 275 mm. As with other stationery, especially embossed wrappers were prepared for certain large commercial users.

IRELAND

The one-half pence issue of 1945 has the same dimensions as the issue of 1924, but is typographed on heavier, more opaque paper. The issue date is uncertain as it could have been issued in 1946. There is a significant problem inherent with Irish postal stationery. Almost, without exception, it has been impossible for postal historians to determine actual issue dates. Post Office records were not maintained in any manner to determine such dates.

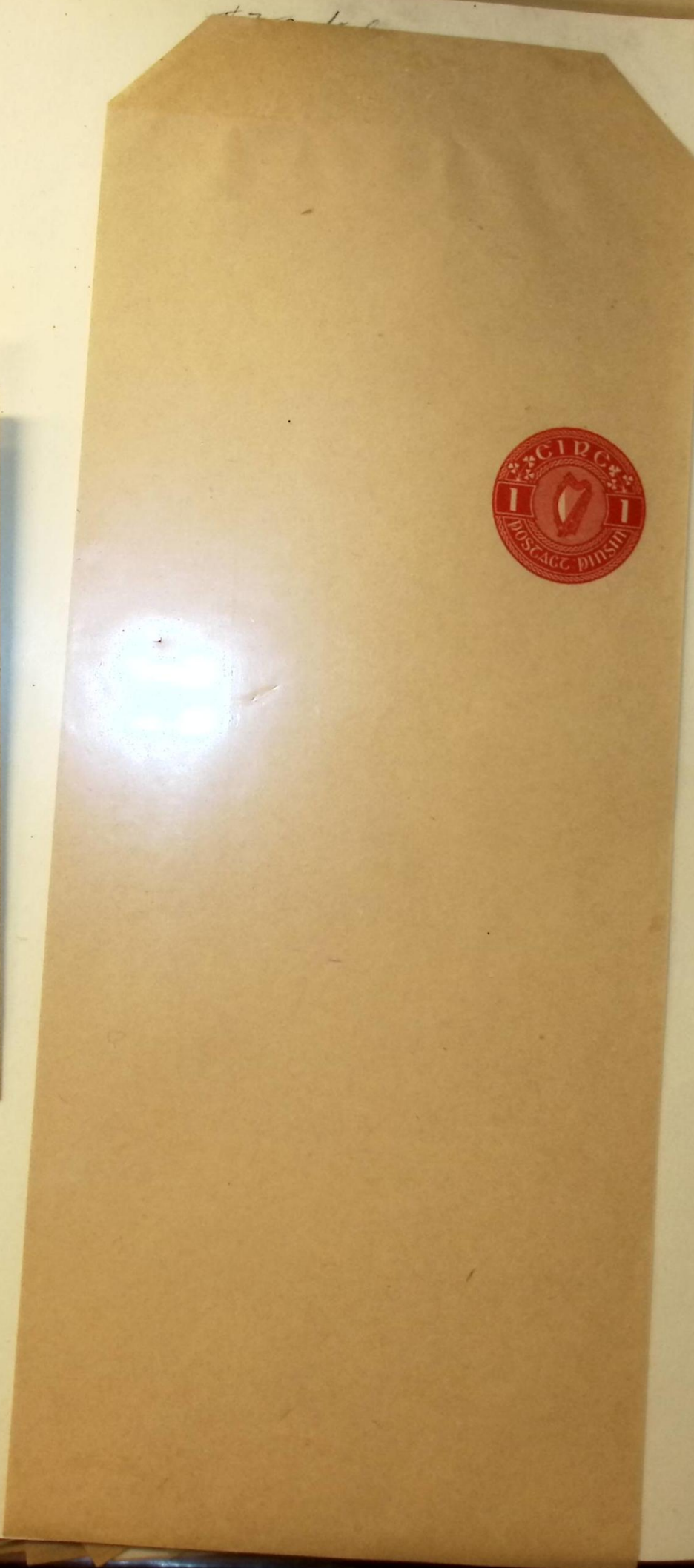
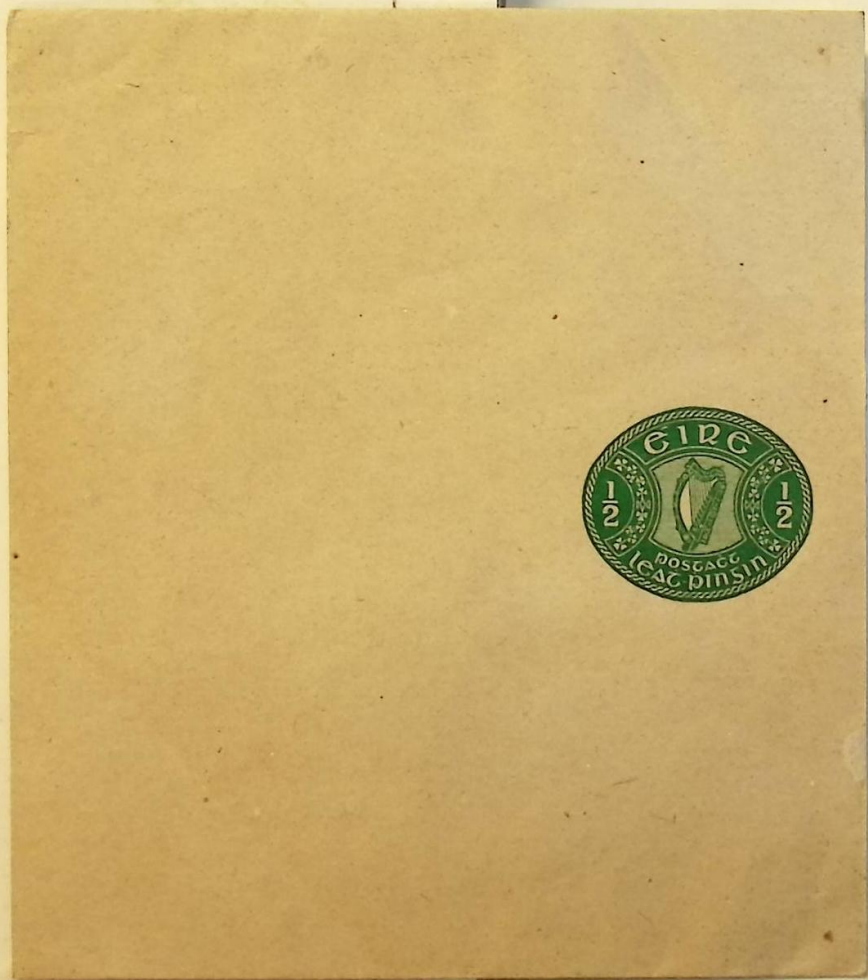

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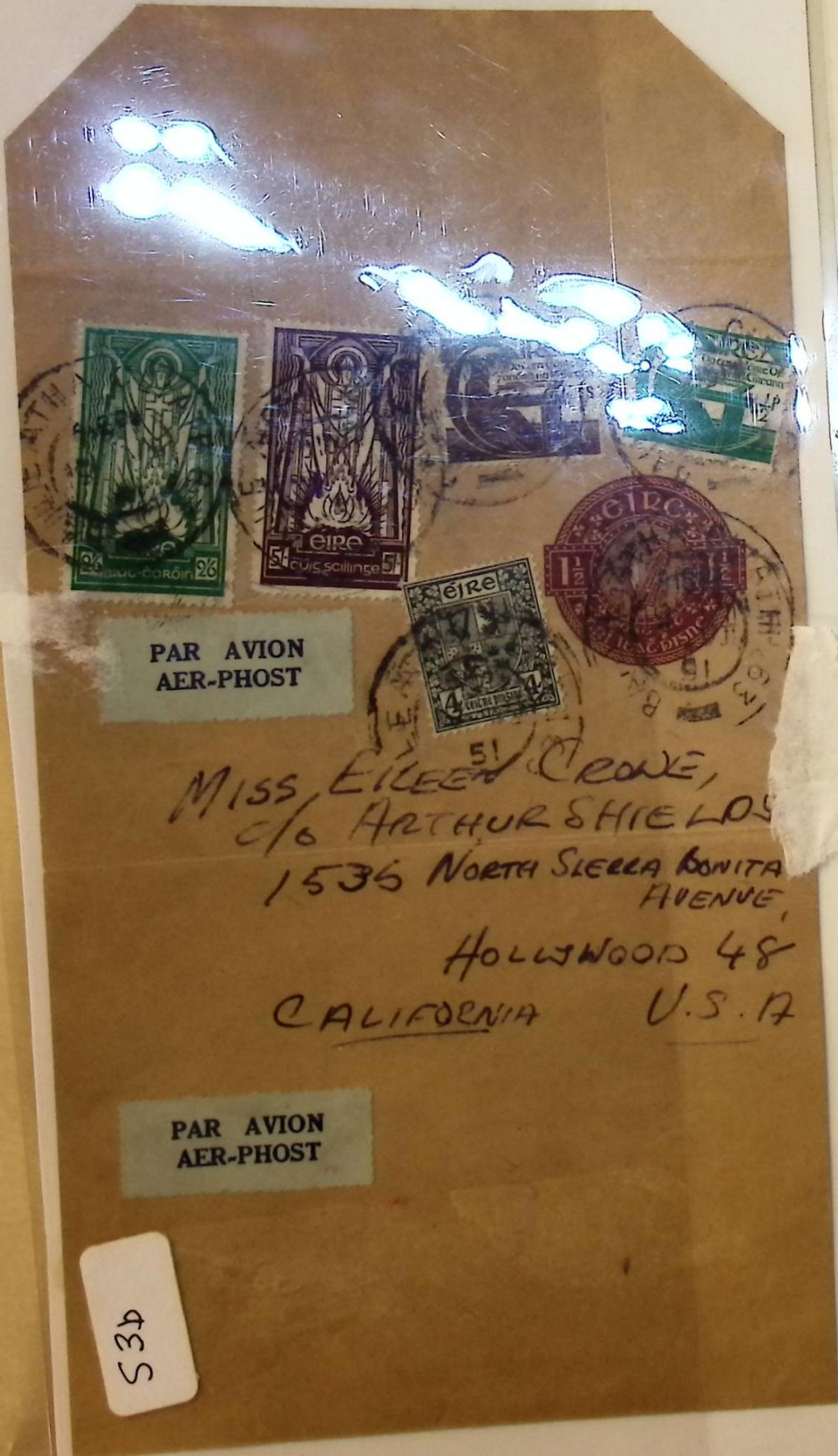
