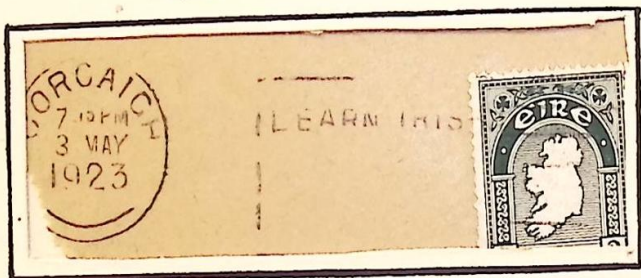

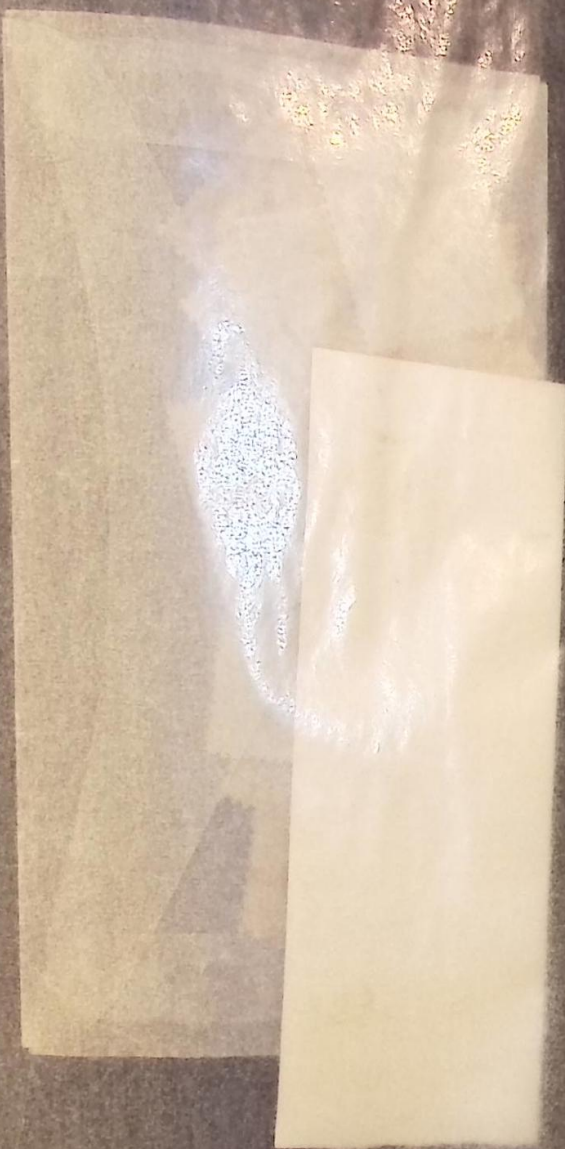


Port-of-Entry Papers

The \$5.00 American Foreign Service Fee Stamp has been cancelled twice: first by a date stamp and secondly by the consulate stamp with a wavy line. The \$5.00 is equal to one pound sterling—no schillings—ten pence in Irish funds.

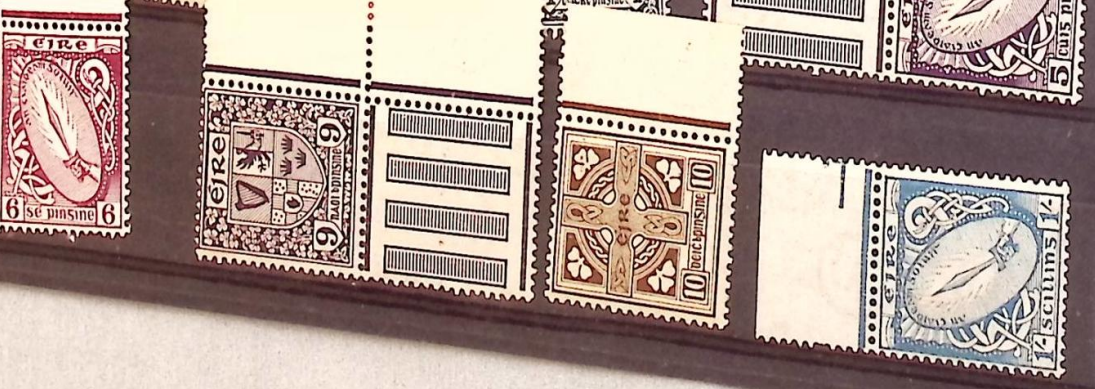




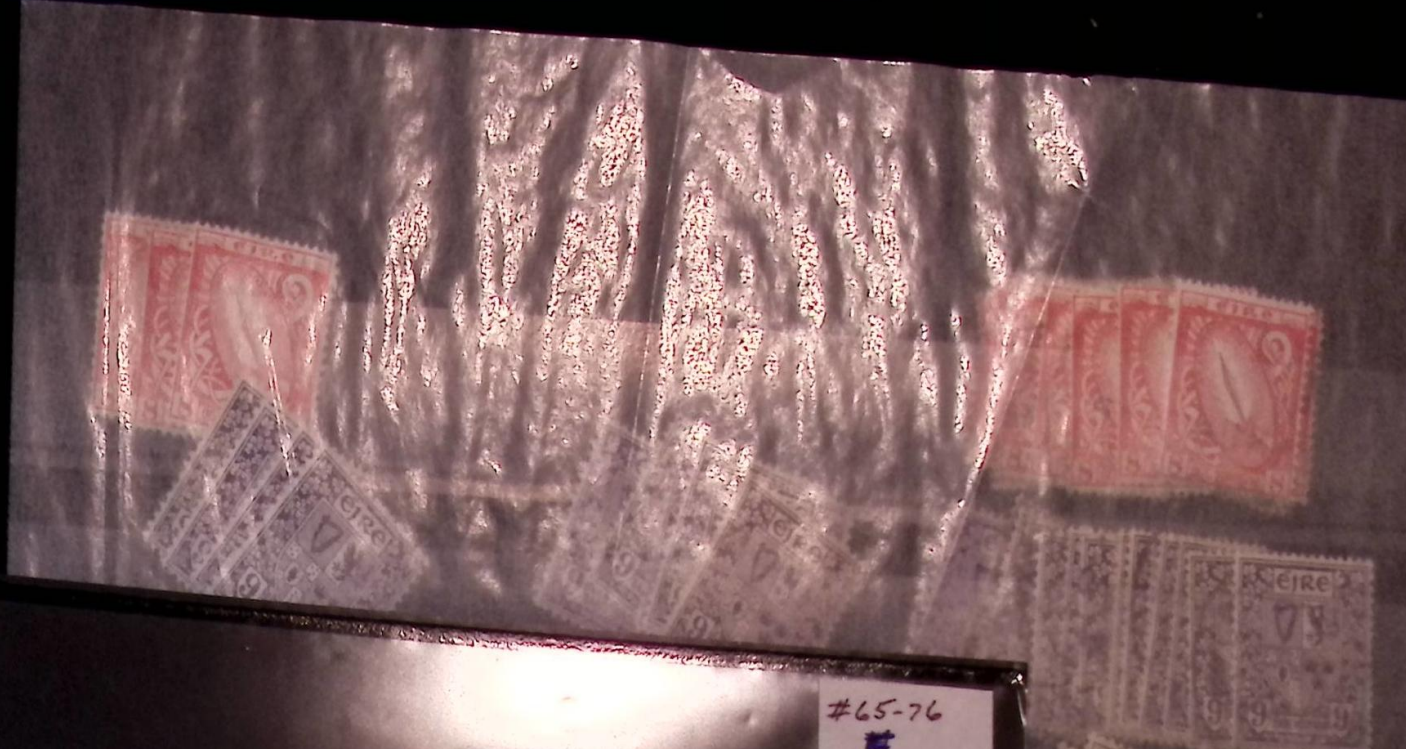

As part of the Architecture series of 1981, which replaced the Gerl series of definitive, An-Post included a 1 pound stamp. The 1 pound stamp was issued on December 15, 1982. The 1 pound stamp was authorized and commonly used on savings cards used to pay for television licenses and telephone bills. The multiple use of this stamp encouraged counterfeiting. Counterfeit stamps were so prevalent that An-Post was forced to withdraw the stamp in November of 1984. On June 27, 1985, An-Post issued a replacement stamp. The new stamp was designed in a vertical format versus the horizontal format of the original. The possession of the counterfeit stamp is illegal in Ireland. The counterfeit stamp also exist imperforated
