There are four plate and perforation types recorded with control F6

The Control F6 plate 9 being the most common and all examples are as that shown.

The item illustrated, enlarged x4, shows that row 19 column 11 is vertically out of alignment.

The cliché (electrotype) in that position must have become damaged and it was cut out with a replacement being inserted. The insertion is almost unnoticeable with the horizontal alignment being virtually perfect and there being only the smallest vertical miss-alignment.

Notice also the cracking in the right side Jubilee line there is evidence that this crack became worse extending as far as row 9 and eventually crossing into the right hand outside frame line of row 9 column 12
