The 15 Centimos value is from Head plate 4 Duty Plate 6; sloping gash in duty plate rule

The 2d value is from Head plate 2 Duty plate 3 sloping gash in head plate rule and break in duty plate rule

The recipient Benedict Prieth was the publisher and Editor of a weekly German language newspaper produced from the business premises at 225 Washington Street Newark New Jersey USA. The newspaper the "New Jersey Freie Zeitung" was initially supplied free on a monthly basis in the hope of attracting a regular subscribers. It was in circulation from April 1858 to 1954.

to your letter of the 8th instant, I enclose the stamps for which you ask. You forwarded a Bank Note value 25 pesetas (Spanish) and a Postal order for 2/6. The value of the Sterling stamps is 8/- (2/6 plus 8 pesetas Spanish). The difference of 17 pesetas (Spanish) is equivalent in Moroccan to 24 pesetas and a 6 pesetas -

The cover despite emanating from the Post Office in Tangier has a "philatelic" franking. 6d= 60 Centimos. The rate for a 1/2ounce registered letter to Paris would have been 4 & 1/2d; 45 Centimos.

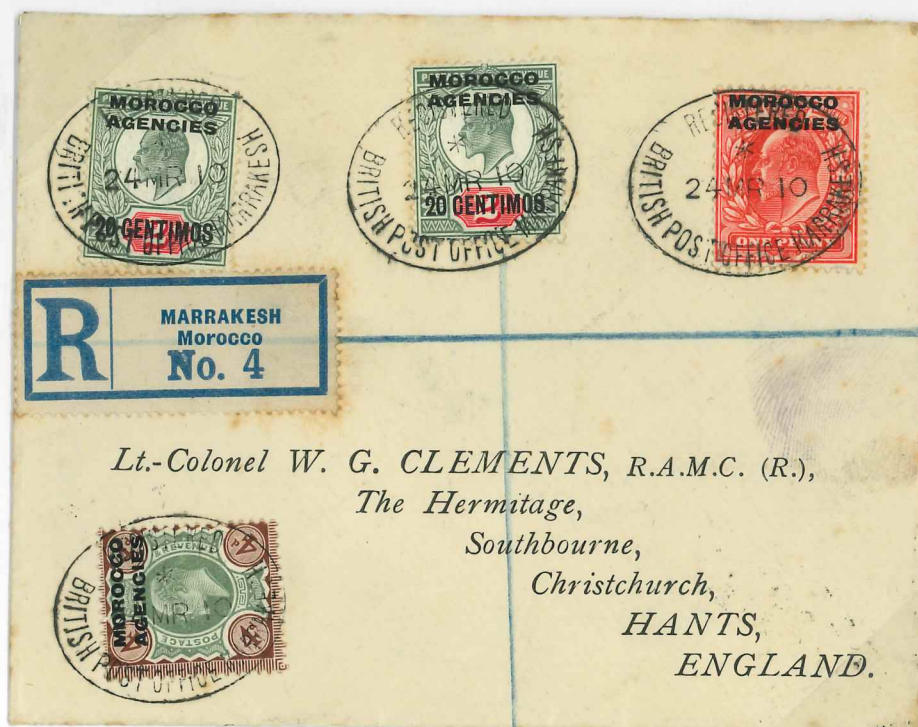

Notice the registration label numbers 220-230 suggesting that at least 10 similar covers were posted on the same day to the same dealer. Also note the manuscript numbers 2478 and 2487 which bears out the assumption of a number of similar covers having been sent on the same day.

One has to wonder where the other items are.

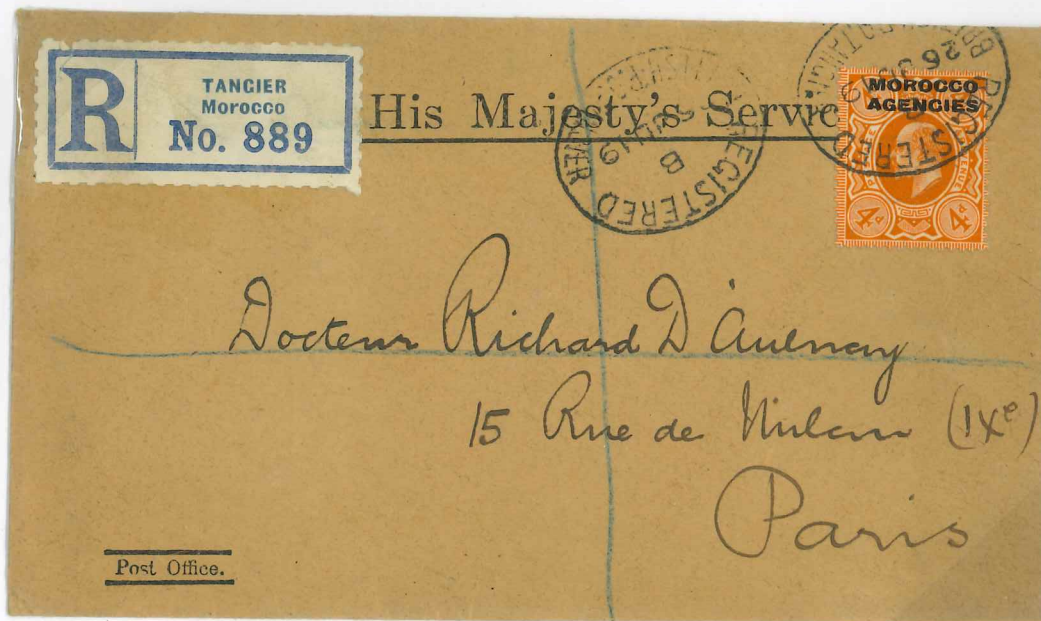

 An ex officer in the Royal Army Medical Corps died age 63 on 16 January 1920

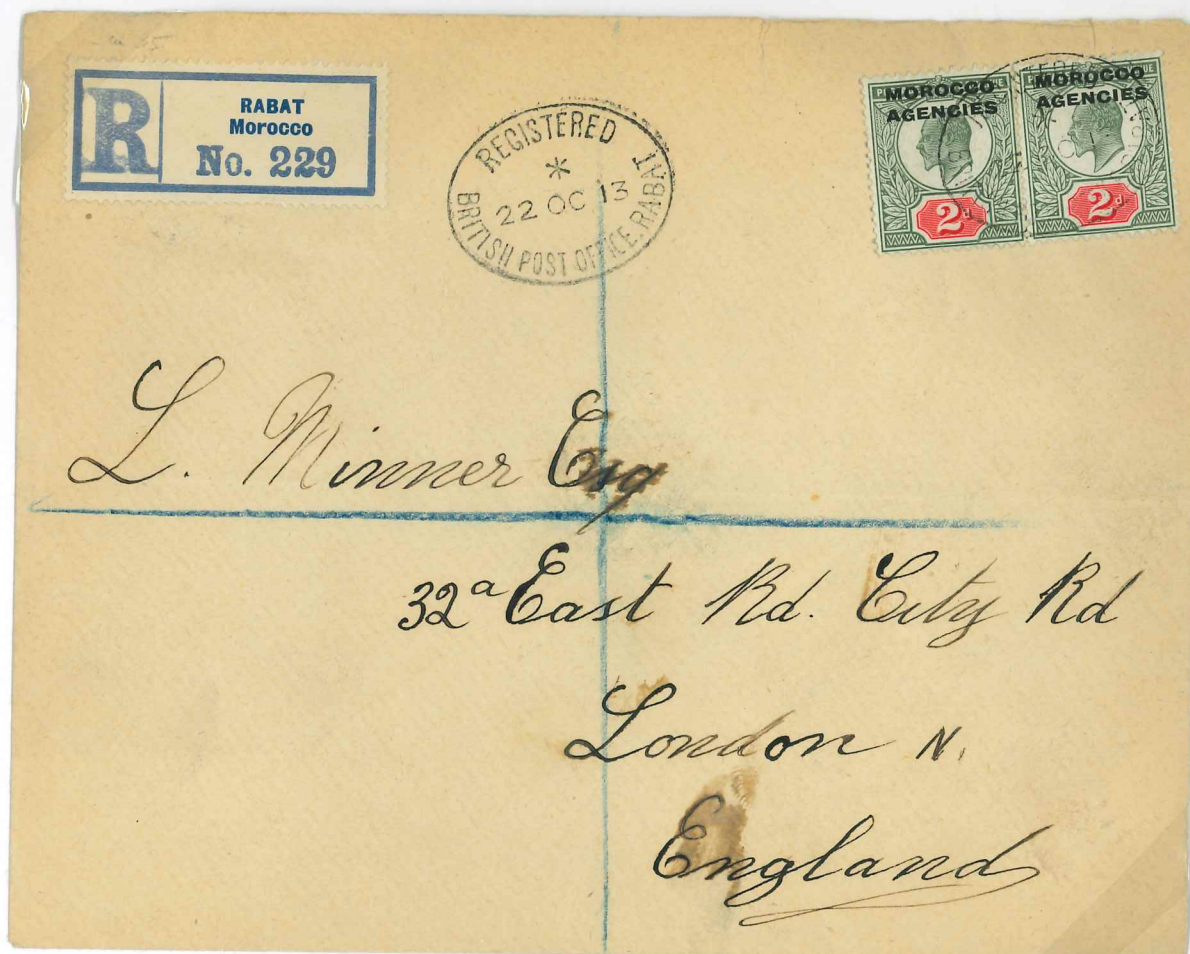

The OHMS envelope suggests correct usage.
The rate for a registered letter to Europe would have been
45 Centimos for 20 grammes.

Whilst the addressee was a well known collector I feel the franking may well be correct
reflecting a ~~slight over payment~~ the then current rate of exchange between Sterling and Spanish pesetas.

Via Tangier 25 OC 1913, arrived London 29 OC 1913

This cover may be commercial in that the recipient is located in a commercial area of London; is not a known philatelic correspondent and the rate 4d could represent a small premium, 1d, over the correct rate 30 Centimos (3d) for a 20 gram registered letter to the UK.

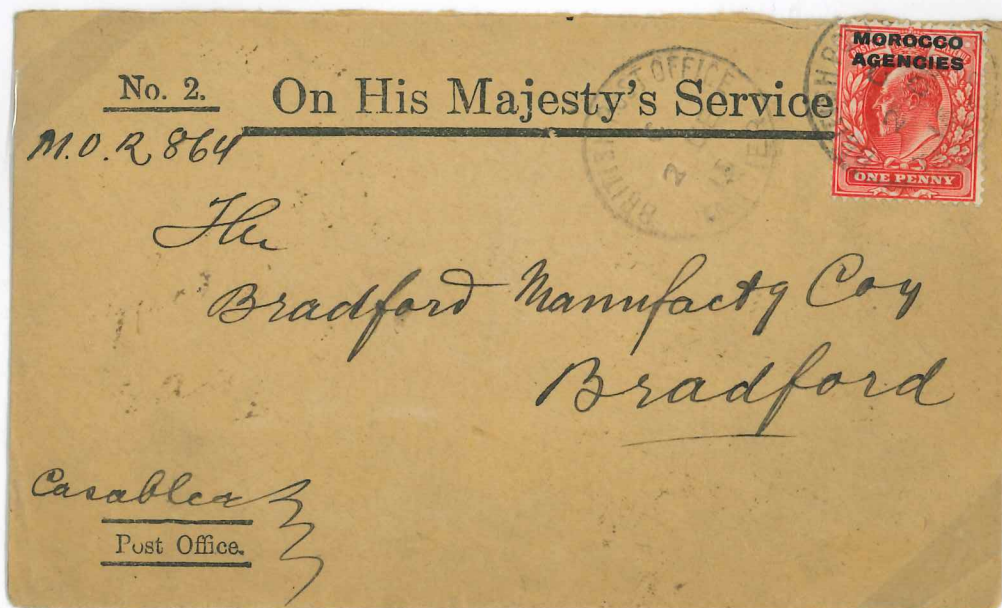

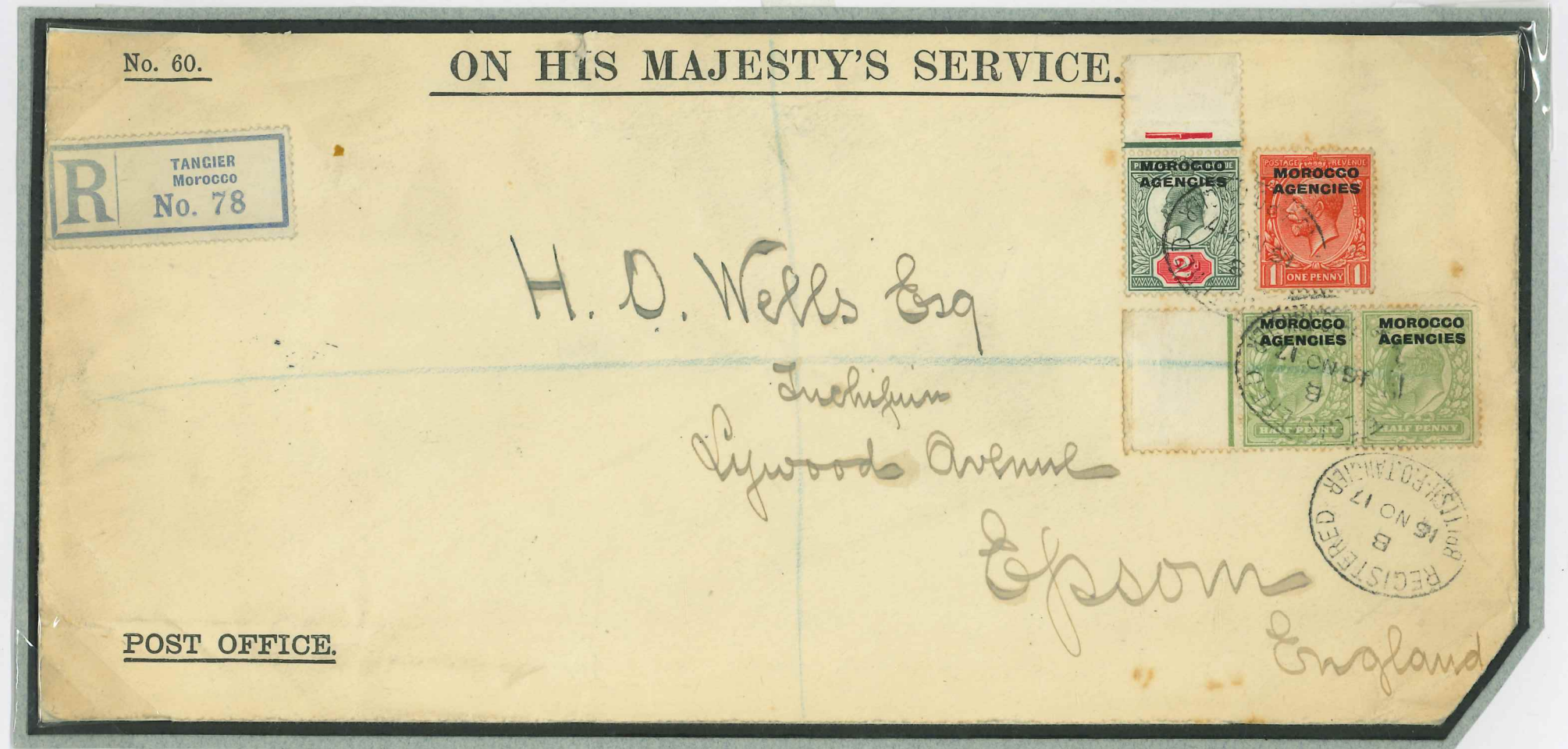
