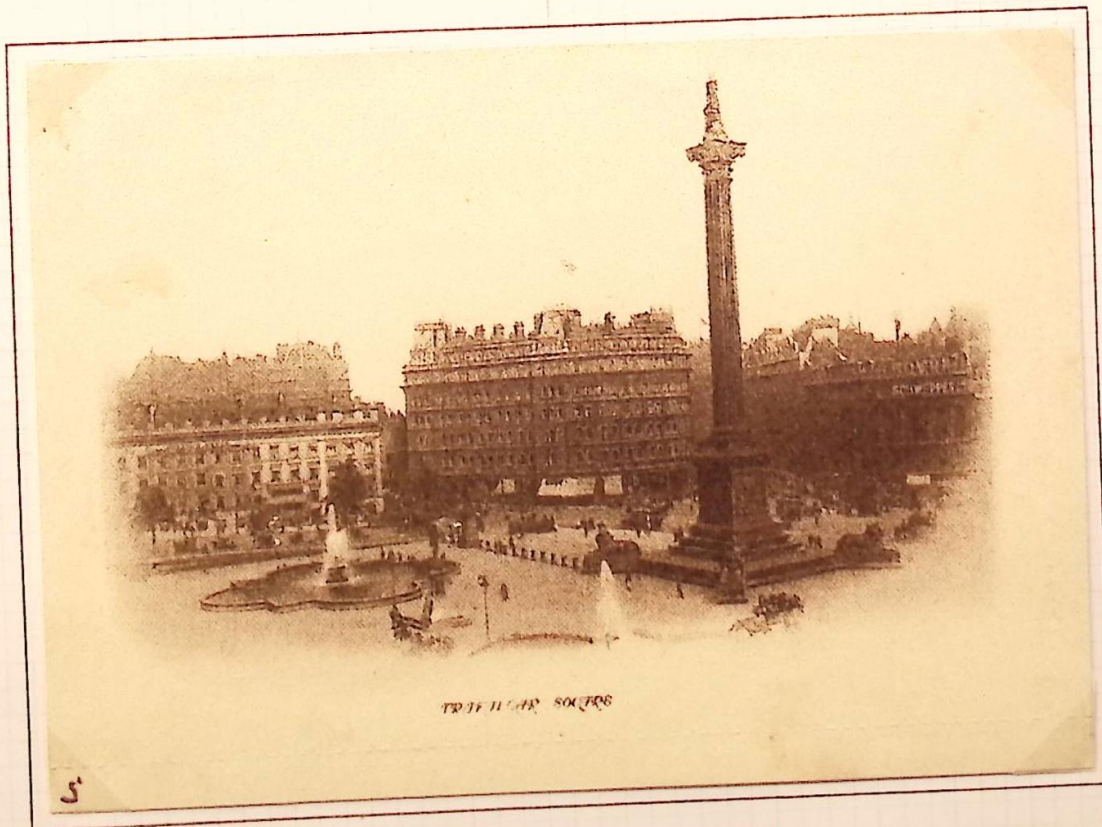

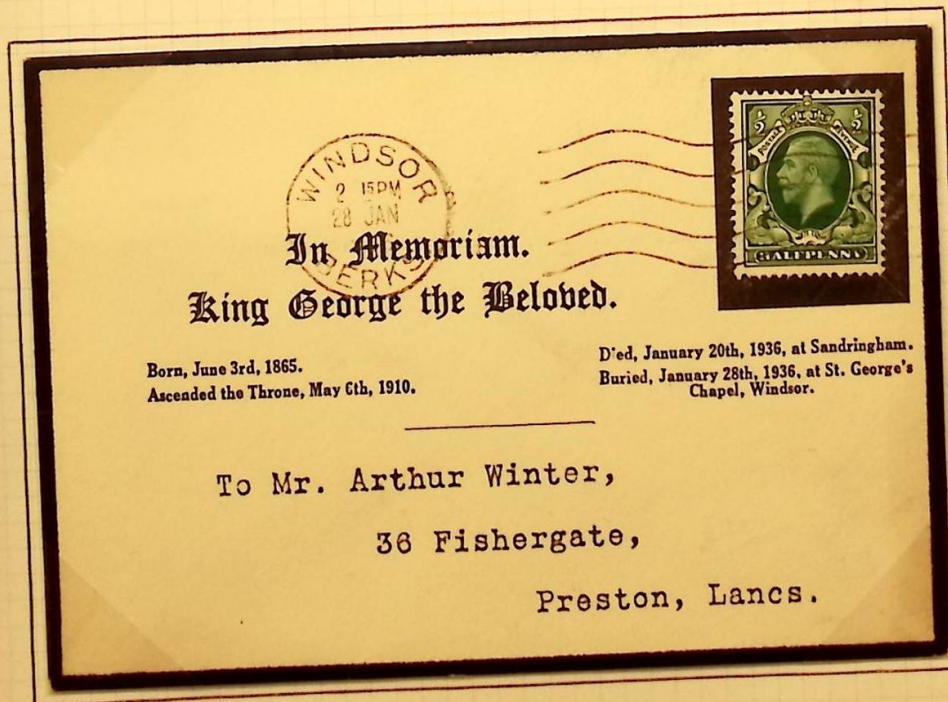

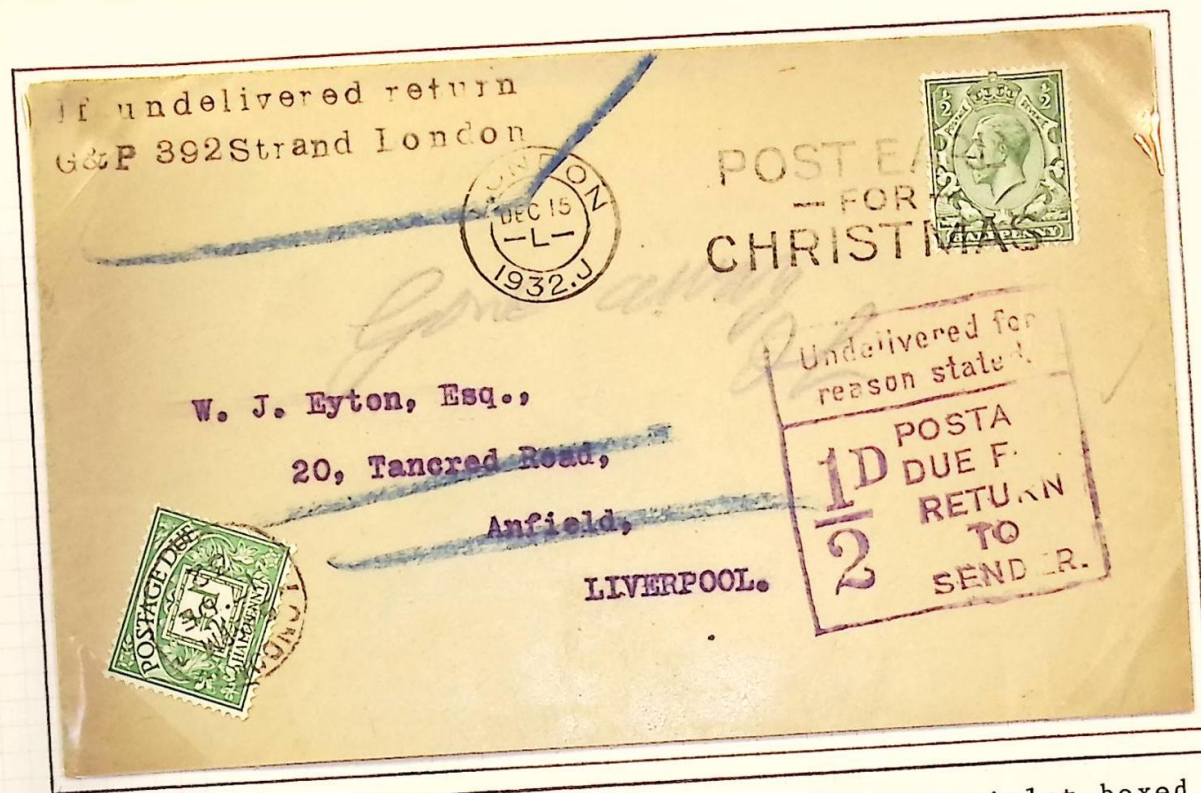

Proposed design for British 'Air Mail' stamps. These essays were sold for one penny each at the 1934 International Air Mail Exhibition.

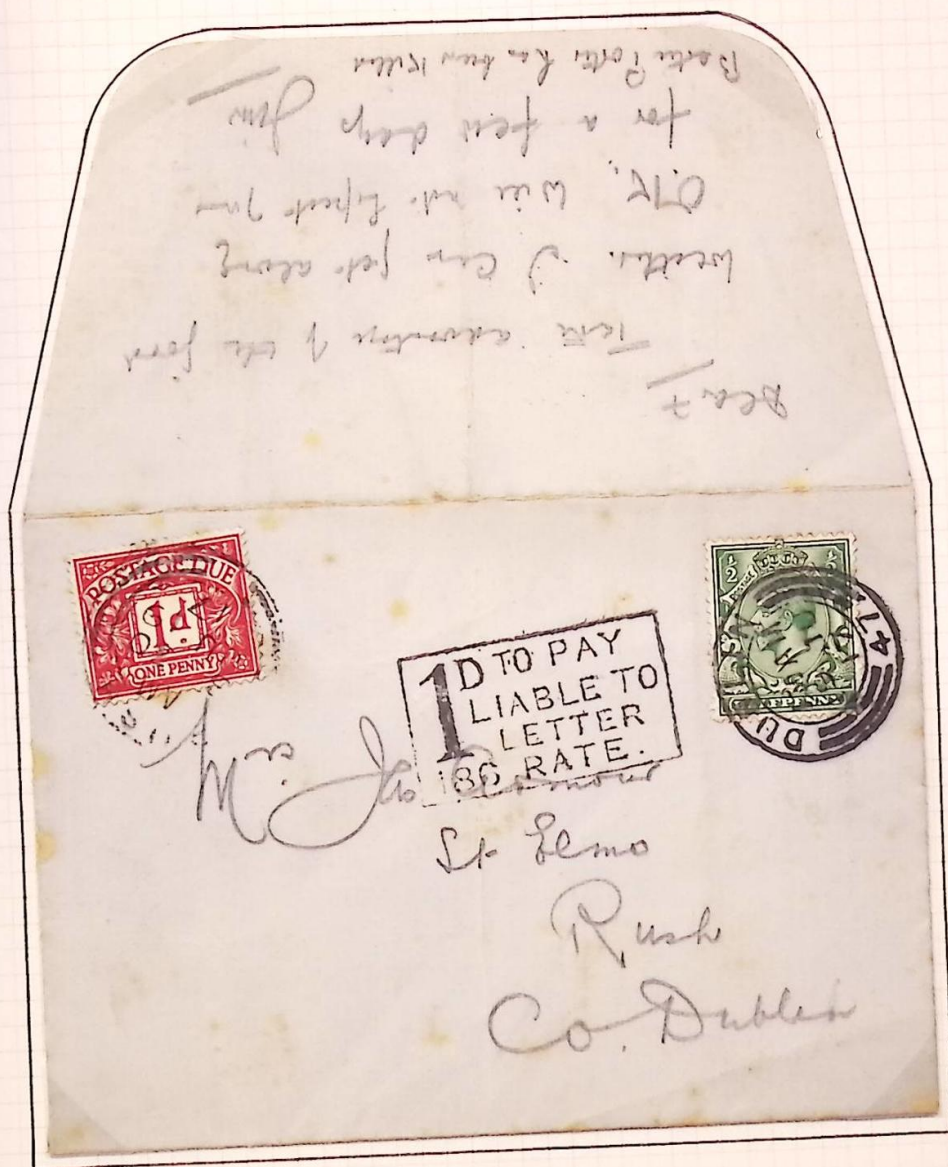


1932 Cover from London to Liverpool with large violet boxed "Undelivered for reason stated, ½d. POSTAGE DUE FOR RETURN TO SENDER" manuscript *Gone away and initialed.* ½d. postage due stamp applied at London dated 17th. December 1932.



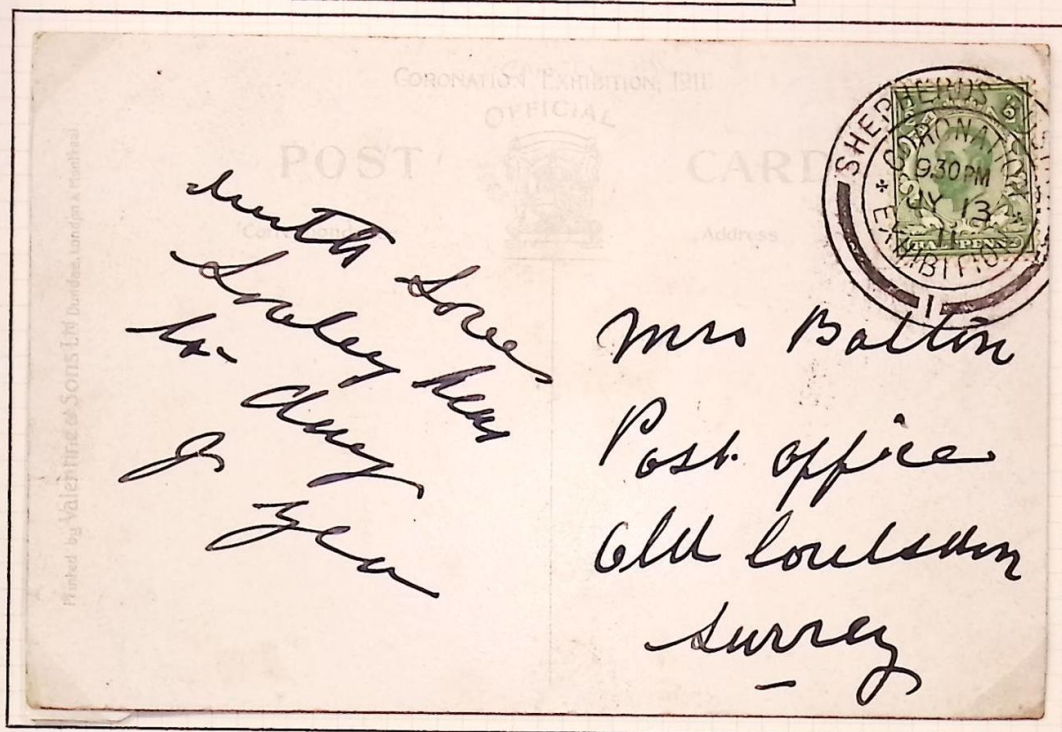
1935 Cover from South Shields, County Durham to London. Postage underpaid by 1d. hence the boxed 2d. TO PAY LIABLE TO LETTER RATE E.C. AT London. 2d. postage due stamp applied and cancelled at London on 14th. October 1935. As the letter was refused and the postman could not collect the surcharge it was overstampd in violet by means of a rubber stamp with a saltire cross across the middle and the heading "SURCHARGE NOT COLLECTED and at the foot FRESH LABEL REQUIRED".

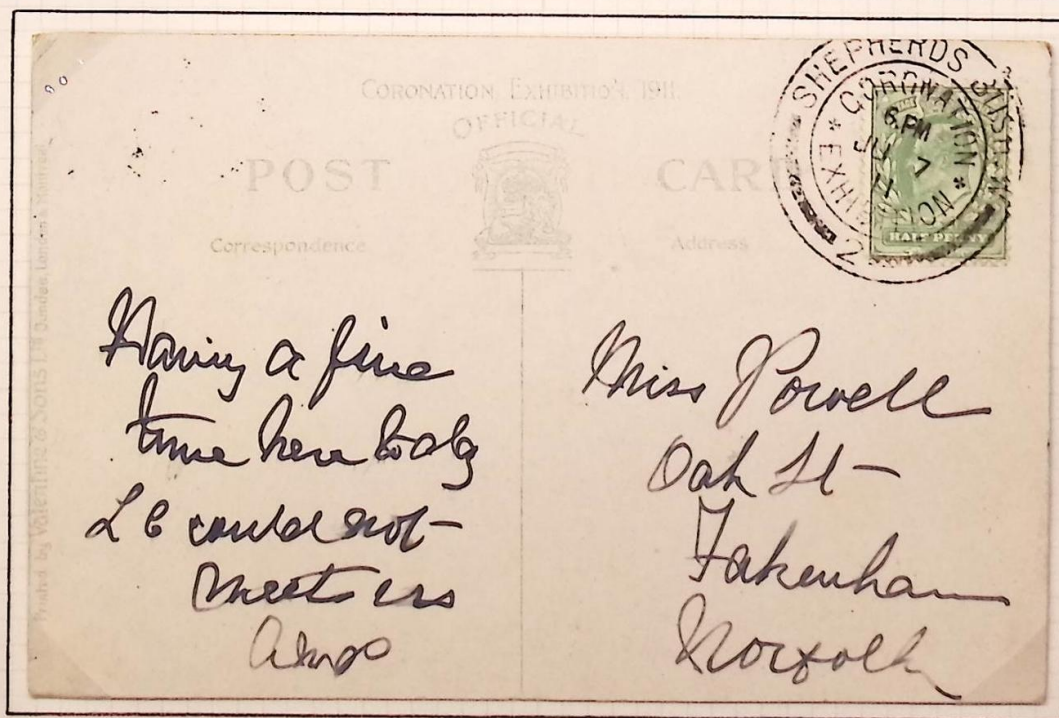


Unsealed envelope posted in Dublin on 19th. June 1917. Postage paid $\frac{1}{2}$ d. at Postcard rate with the message written on the back flap. Post Office mark 1d. TO PAY LIABLE TO LETTER RATE 186. Surcharged by 1d. Postage Due label cancelled by a double ring handstamp of RUSH 19th. June 1917.

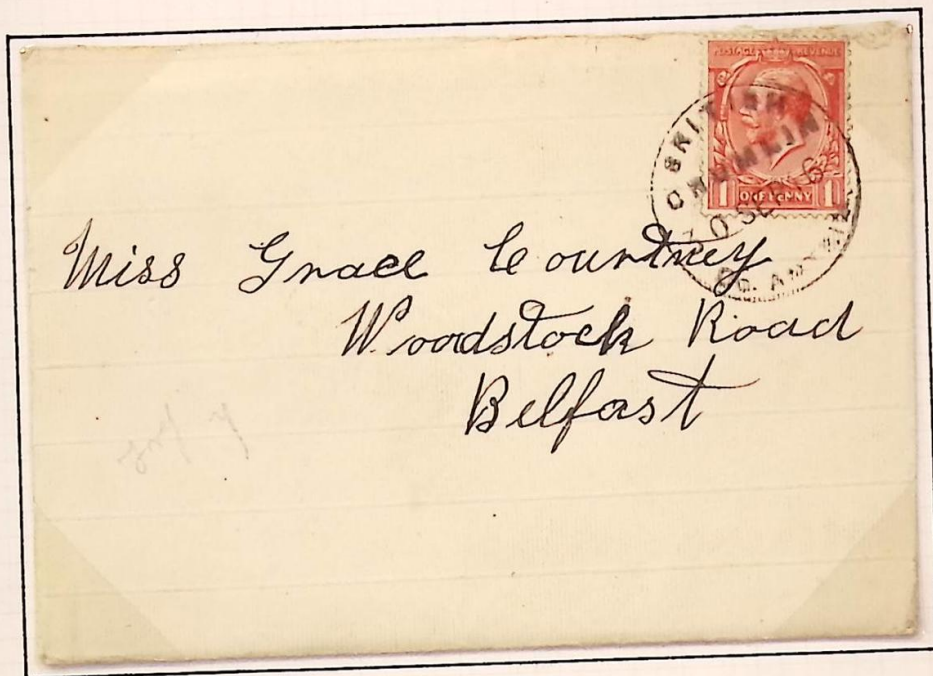

1906 Card from Londonderry to Penzance, Cornwall. $\frac{1}{2}$ d. Edward VII adhesive cancelled by a Londonderry double-circle handstamp. The card had a packet of shamrock seeds on the front which made it liable for letter rate. The instructional mark and the 1d. (postage due) mark with the Post Office Number 609 were applied at Penzance.



1917 Card from Belfast to Portadown. Posted in late-fee posting box at the railway station. The 1d. surcharge mark was probably applied on board the train in the travelling Post Office. The boxed "Posted Without Late Fee" with 375 at the base was applied at Portadown as was the handstamp cancelling the $\frac{1}{2}$ d. George V stamp. The application of these marks alerted the postmen at the office of delivery to the fact that a charge had to be raised and this was effected by means of a postage due stamp.

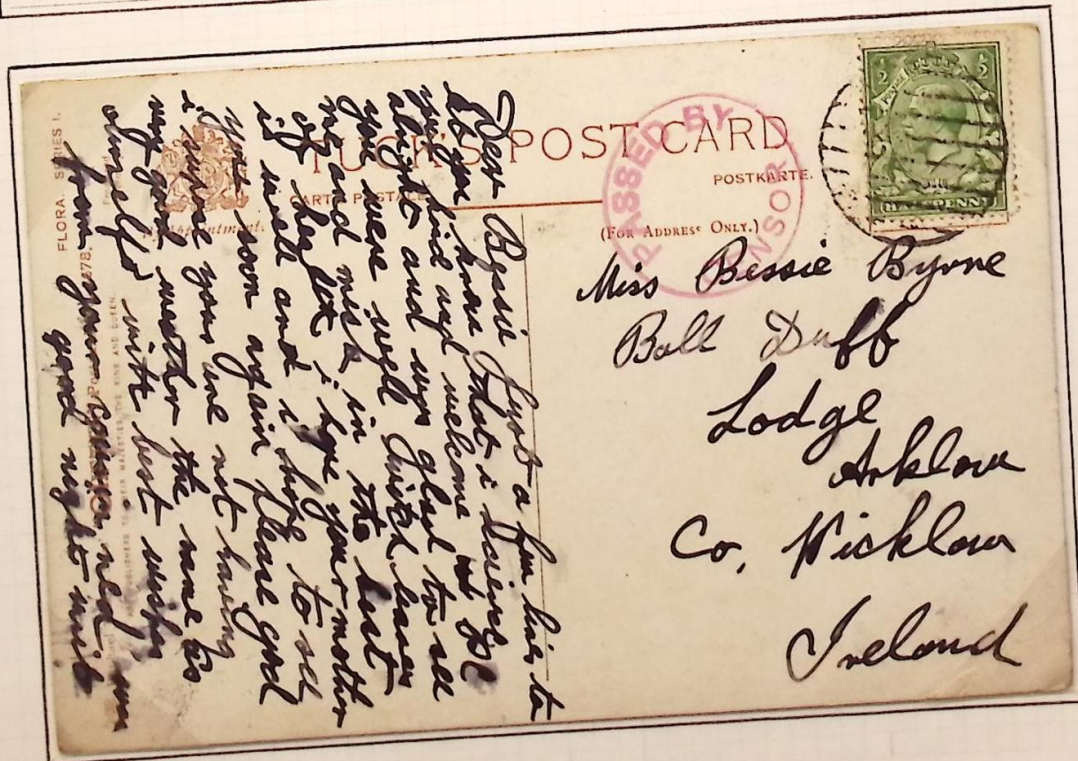


BRITISH was the name of a district in County Antrim to the north of Crumlin and the post office in the area bore that name. In a re-organisation of the area, BRITISH sub post office was re-named ALDERGROVE from the 1st. January 1939.

CENSORED MAIL
1914 - 1918 WAR



Mail from the Home Fleet was cancelled by Dumb type obliterators during the First World War. On these two cards the stamps are cancelled by a gridded circle with eight cross lines. One has a straight line PASSED BY CENSOR in blue, the other one a red circular mark.



CENSORED SHIP MAIL
1914 - 1918 WAR



Cover sent to London, stamp cancelled by dumb type handstamp. Blue boxed 'CENSORED IN SHIP'.



Postcard to Whitwell, Co. Antrim, stamp cancelled by dumb type handstamp. Postcard depicts a sailor with H. M. S. ANTRIM on his cap.

Type I. Has "FPE" of HALFPENNY with solid shading. Type II. Has solid shading at top, lightly shaded at base and watermark inverted. Type III. As Type II but frame lines below HALFPENNY thinner.



Type I. Wide shading between "NN" of HALFPENNY. Type II. Narrow shading between "NN" and watermark inverted. Type III. Wide shading between "NN", deeper shading in fleur-de-lis and surround than in Types I or II.



Type I. Top frame lines thick. Type II. Top frame lines thin and watermark inverted. Type III. As Type II but upper frame lines thickened above "JU" of JUBILEE.



Designs by Barnett Freedman. Printed in photogravure by Harrison and Sons. Watermark Block Cypher. Perforation 15 X 14.



1937 Cover posted in Hastings with a green Post Office coil machine testing label (nicknamed "a poached egg") used to pay $\frac{1}{2}$ d. of the postage. As this was fraudulent the cover should have been surcharged but must have slipped through the post unnoticed.

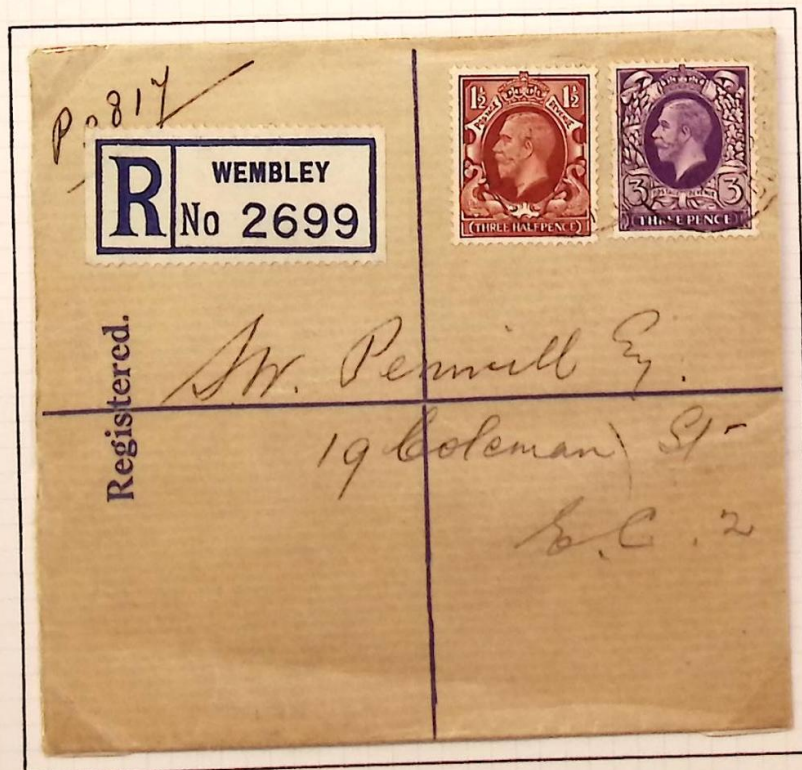


A similar cover to the one above posted in Hastings with two "poached eggs" used to prepay 1d. of the postage. This cover is surcharged 2d. to pay in manuscript and has a 2d. postage due stamp applied.

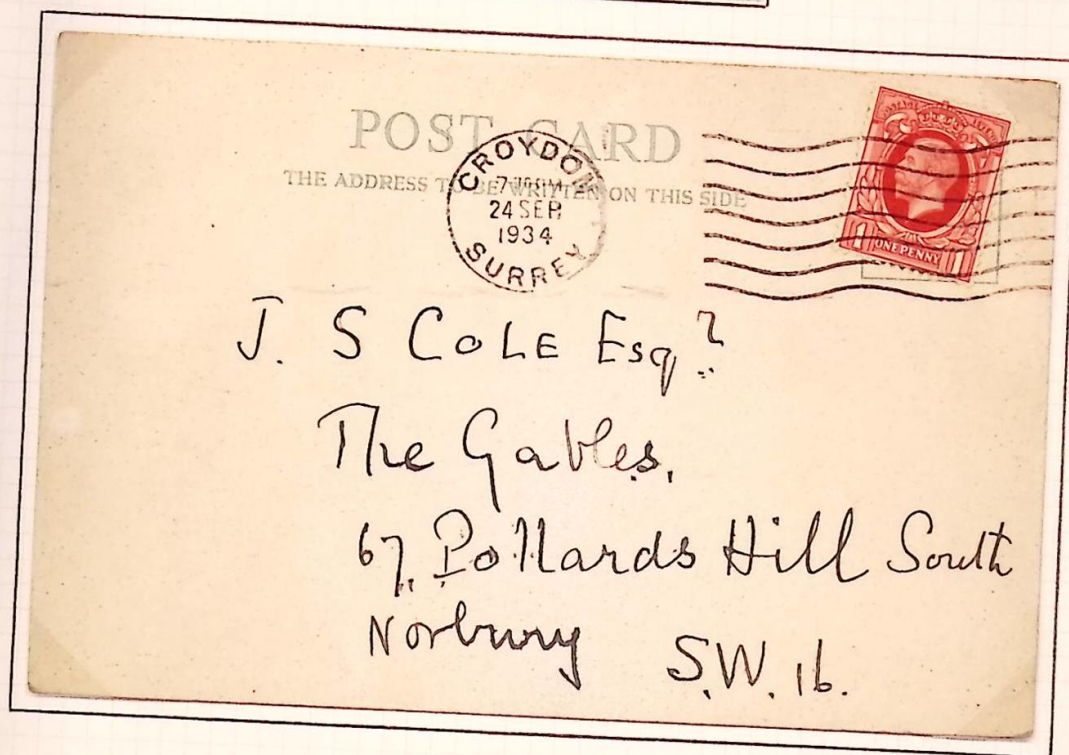

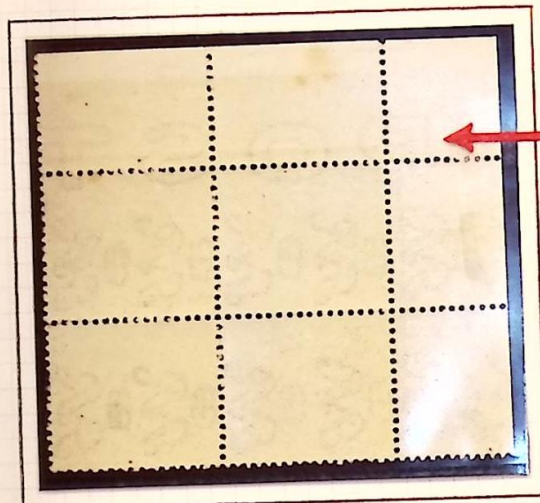

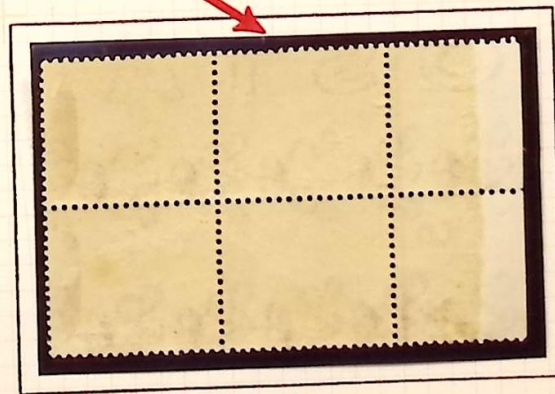

The watermark "POSTAGE" appears in the margins on both sides of each pane. Occasionally sheets were incorrectly fed into the printing press, resulting in the word "POSTAGE" appearing on five stamps of the first or the twelfth vertical rows.

3rd. October 1938. First Air Mail, Leeds to London. Cover with 'North Eastern Airways Ltd.' cachet also clock type received 3 Oct. 1938 mark. 1½d. stamp tied by Empire Exhibition, Glasgow slogan cancel.

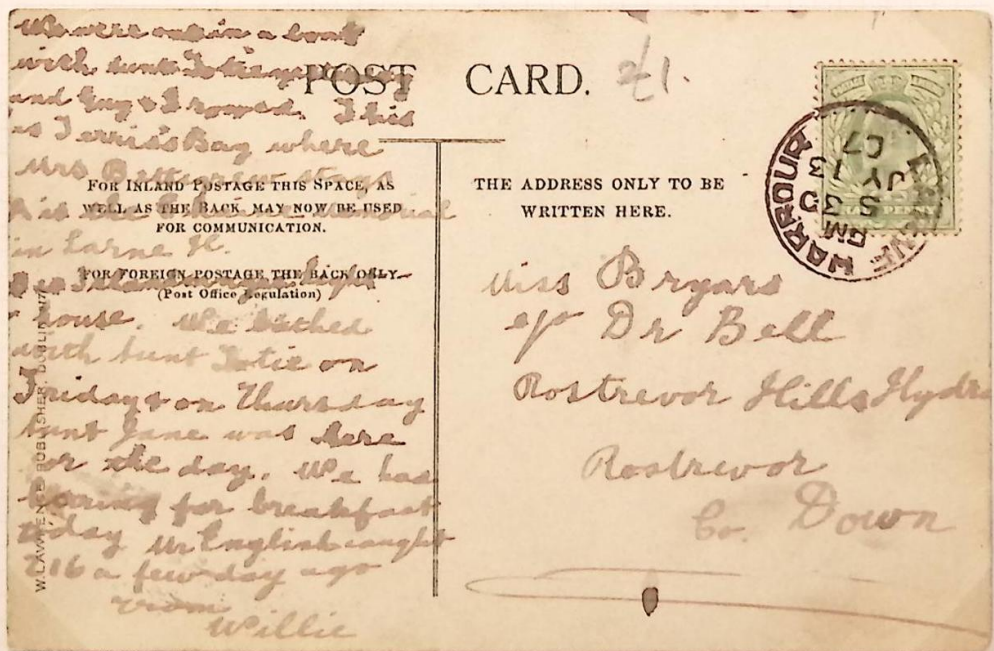
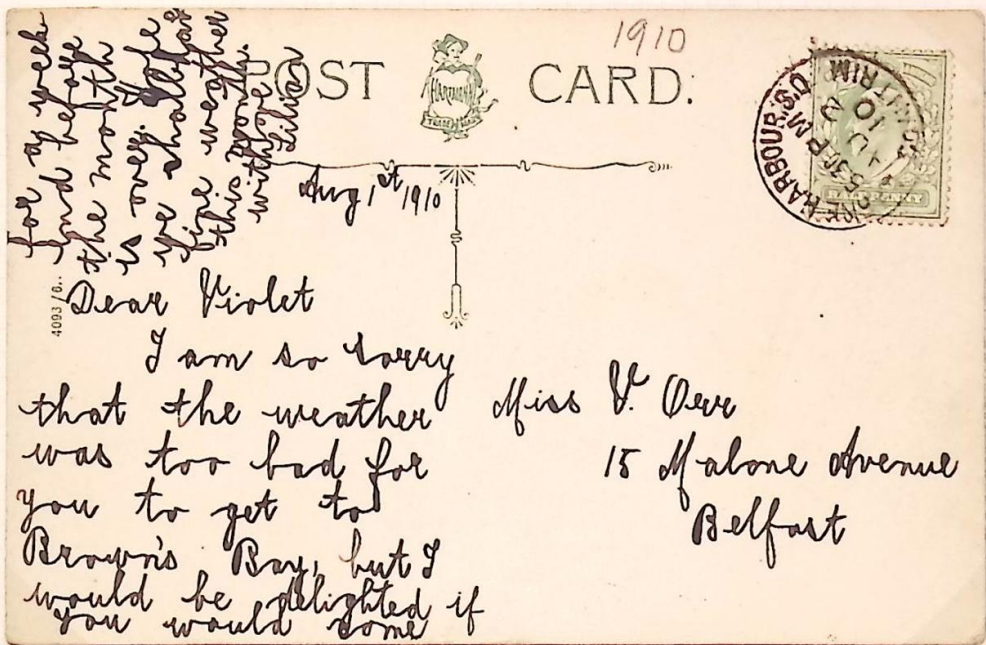
