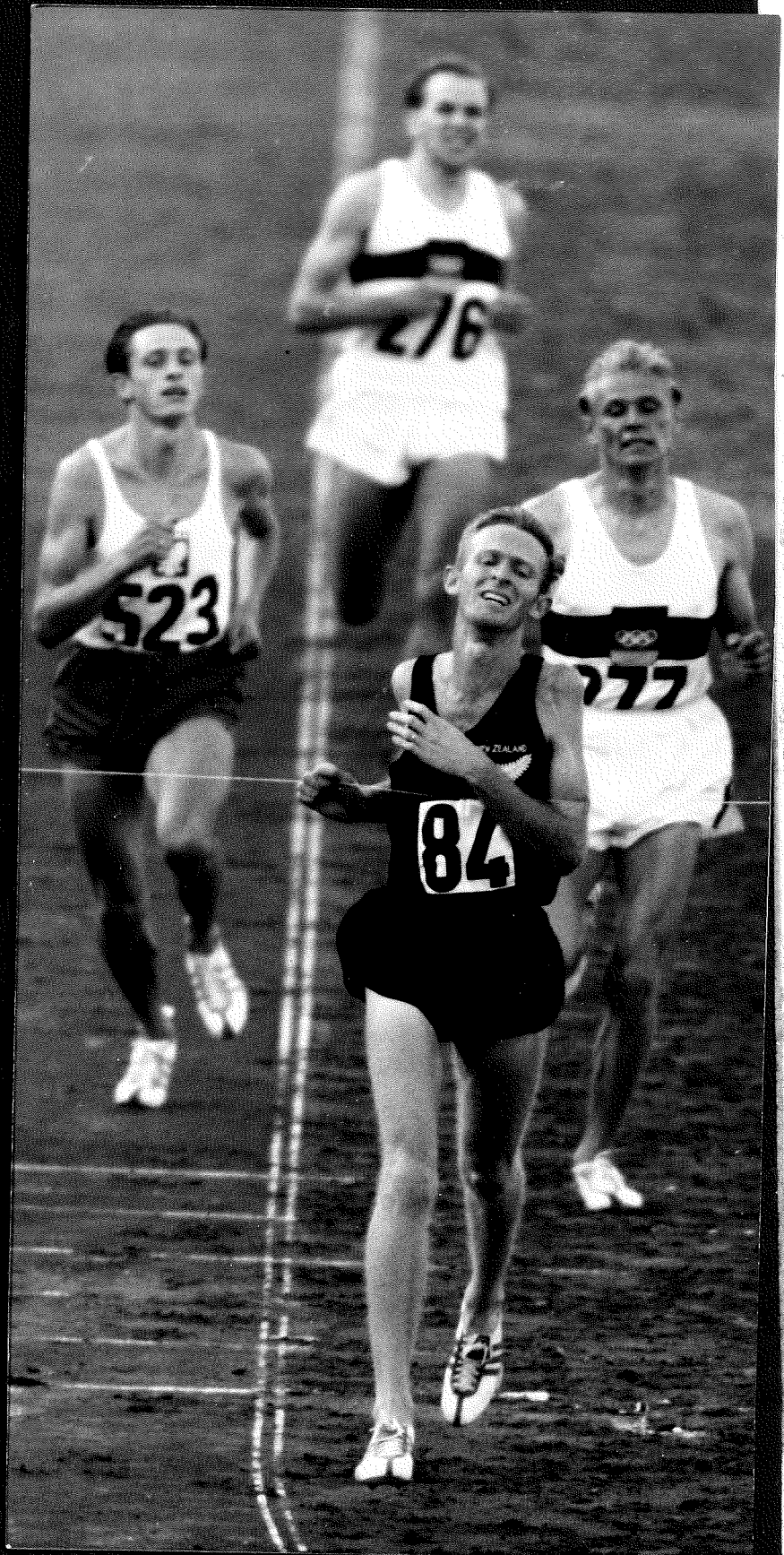

NOW HURLS THE DISCUS FOR THE UNITED STATES

Four years ago in Melbourne, a young Czech girl, Olga Fokotova hurled a discus a distance of 53 metres 69 to win the event and set up an Olympic record. Today, she made her appearance in the Rome Olympic Stadium but with a changed name and nationality.

On the entry list she appears as Olga Connolly of the United States, for after the Melbourne Olympics she became the bride of Harold Connolly the American hammer-throwing star, who holds both the Olympic and world records for the field event.

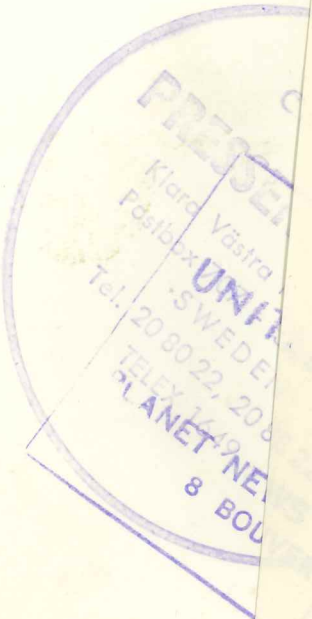

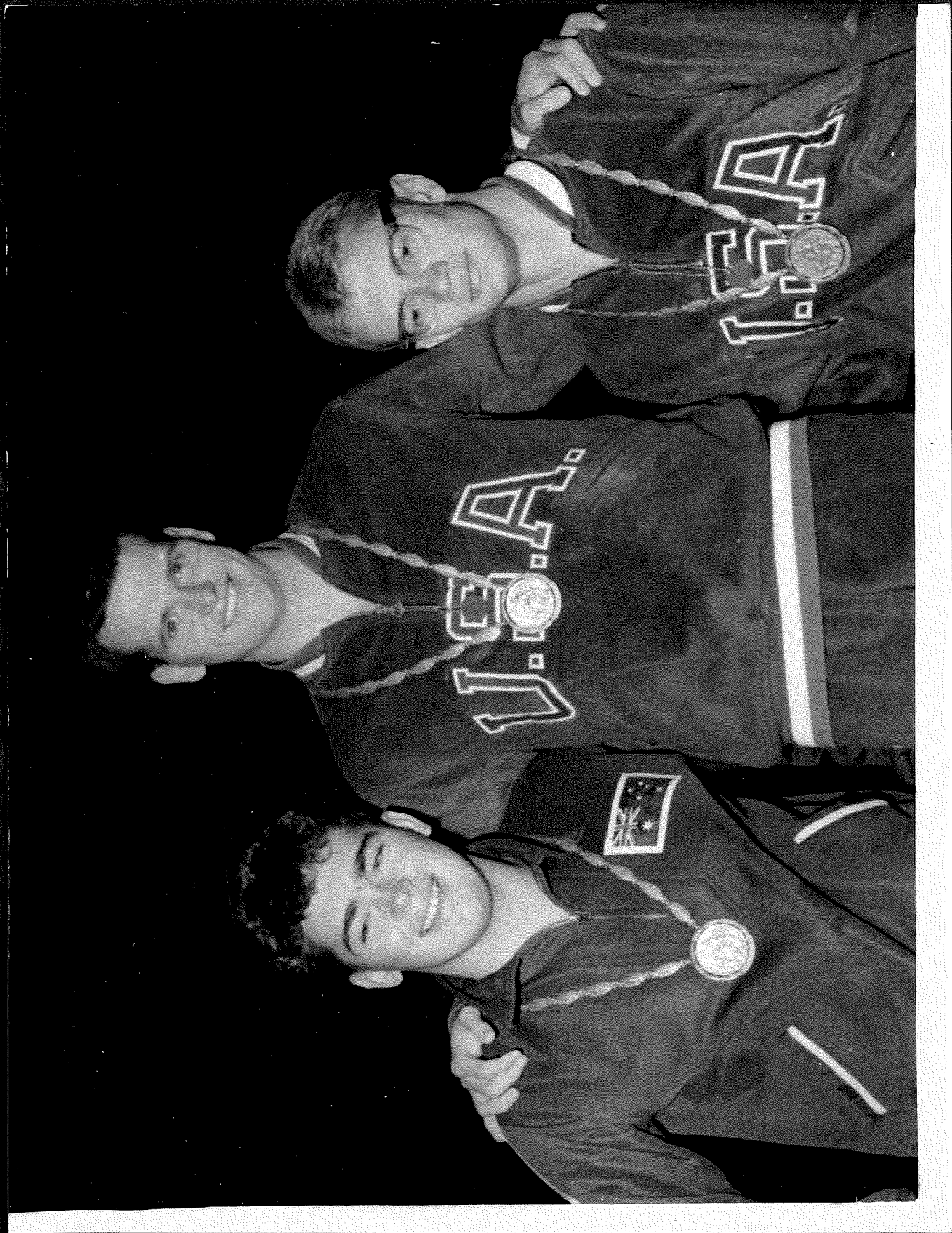

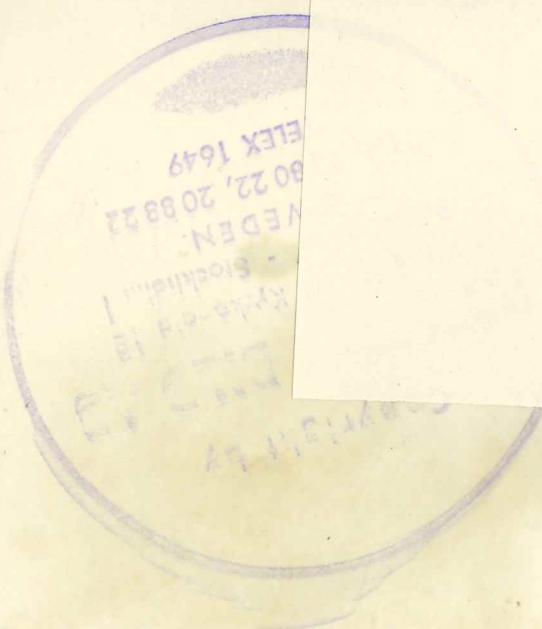

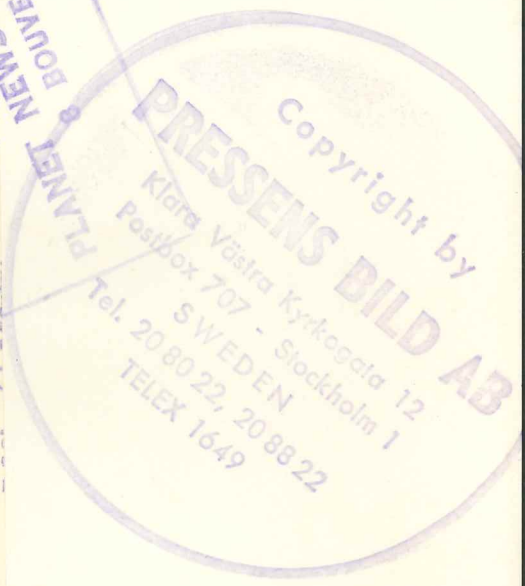

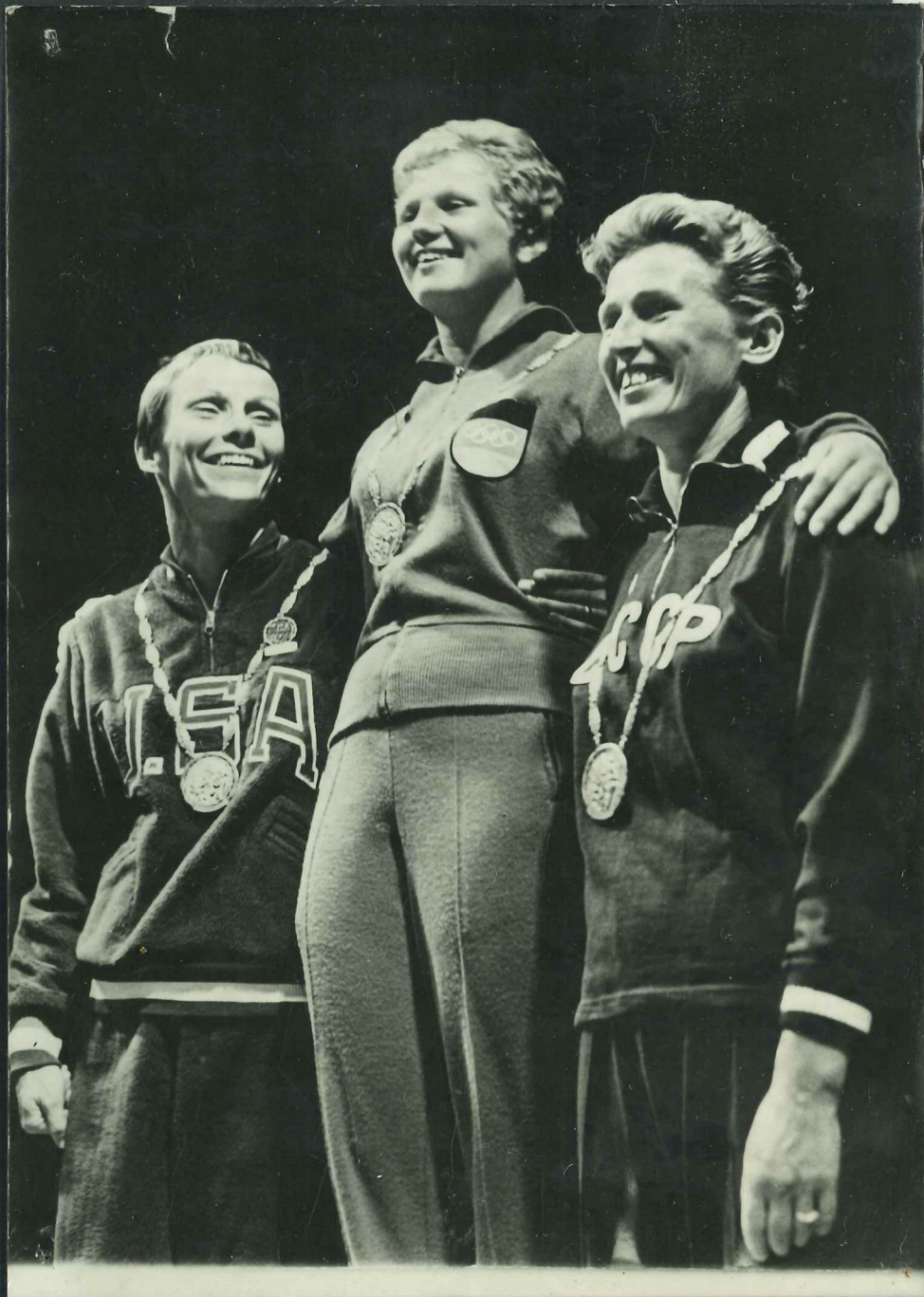
