# The Kustendje-Czernawo


BETWEEN 1867 and 1871, a single 20 paras, black on green lithographed stamp was issued by the Danube and Black Sea Railway, for use on mail carried between the Black Sea port of Kustendje, and Czernawoda, on the Danube.

Being a single stamp with punched perforations in a single colour, it might be presumed that it would not take up much room in a collection of old time locals. Such a presumption, however, would be far from fact!

Instead of being just a copy of this value mint (scarce) and used (rare on cover with Lloyd circular cancellation RRR) there are the reprints to take into account. Not just one reprint, but three. Also for some reason—possibly to confuse latter-day Cinderella collectors?—all three reprints exist in the issued black on green, plus black on the totally bogus colours of blue, yellow, orange, and pink. All these having the same punched-perforations as the original.

So far so good. That's another three types, each in five colours—but wait! The third reprint (the most common:









All the different reprint types are listed in *Cinderella Philatelist*, vol. I pages 114–16, penned by the expert hand of

H. G. Leslie Fletcher. He then goes on with the forgeries! Four different types of these are listed, the first being the most commonly seen, Fournier forgery, which exists in five colours (as above) punched perfs. or imperf. In addition to these four, he added details of a fifth forgery type on page 64 of vol. 3. A sixth imitation is also known to the writer.

Forgery types two to six appear to be even scarcer than the original. No. 3 is reported as irregular perf. 11½; the others being punched perfs. of various types, or imperf. Mr. Fletcher recorded the second, third and fourth forgeries in black on green, and the fifth one as black on yellow. The writer has seen the latter also in green: as well as the sixth. But as to how many different coloured papers they were printed on, has yet to be fully recorded. (The writer has yet to see Fletcher types 2 and 3.)

Finally—as if that lot didn't fill up sufficient space, copies often come along with faked cancellations. (The writer has them on an original and all three reprints!) So take care when buying a "genuine" used one! Ask for a certificate; it might

be worth it!





