Stamp cancellation marks are arousing deep interest among philatelists, and rare effects, such as the one reproduced here, have a high value.

This is an ordinary penny red, in which King George V appears to be wearing a forage cap. Mr. Edward Young, a Finchley collector, told the "Sunday Pictorial": "I have sorted tens of thousands of stamps to find the 'cap' perfectly poised, as it is here. If I had been paid a shilling an hour to find such a stamp I would have earned £1,204. The odds against finding a replica are seven million to one."

KING'S PEACEF

New Queen Flies: Home Tomorrow

PRINCE CHARLES HEIR TO THRONE

IT IS WITH THE MOST PROFOUND GRIEF THAT WE ANNOUNCE THE DEATH OF OUR BELOVED SOVEREIGN, KING GEORGE VI. HE DIED PEACEFULLY IN HIS SLEEP EARLY THIS MORNING AFTER RETIRING TO HIS REST IN HIS USUAL HEALTH AT SANDRINGHAM LAST NIGHT.

IN accordance with constitution, Princess Elizabeth became Queen immediately on the death of the King. This is the first time in British history a Sovereign has acceded the Throne while abroad in the Commonwealth.

Queen Elizabeth is returning to London by air from Kenya today. She arrives at London Airport at 6 p.m. tomorrow.

The King died where he was born, at Sandringham, though it was in the smaller York Cottage in the grounds near the big house, Sandringham Park, that he was born on Dec. 14, 1894.

Windsor Castle, Sandringham House, becomes Dowager Queen Mother, as her granddaughter is Queen. There are no recent precedents for this.
