

### Provenance:

1995, ex Cooley collection, Shreves Auction, 23 September 1995, lot 229, described: "...the block is of most attractive appearance with mostly wide margins all round, just touching or barely cutting at a few points, cover has been professionally cleaned and restored (including mending some splitting of file folds), one vertical file fold passes through bottom row of block mildly creasing stamps...."

### Remarks:

The largest block from plate 4 used on cover recorded by me to date.

### **Scarcity:**

Only three blocks of six from plate 4 used on cover are recorded by me to date (all touched or cut into margins).
