

Windsor, Rose & Co.

(1884 – ca. 1892)

It is unknown when the firm changed its name from Windsor, Redlich & Co to Windsor, Rose & Co when Mr. Paul Rose, a German, was admitted as partner. It seems likely that this happened about 1884 based on dated philatelic items.

The firm had their headquarters in Bangkok with a branch office in Hamburg. They evolved into a large shipping and import-export business. They were agents for banks, steamship companies and numerous insurance companies.
