Growth and Services

Growth and taxes: Registered, Unpaid Mail and Official Inland Revenue indicating the further development of Scottish commerce.

Registration services were introduced in Edinburgh and Glasgow, beginning with early systems for sending coins or banknotes only. Both Edinburgh and Glasgow were centers of commerce, and used distinctive postmarks in connection with the service, changing formats over time. Struck in black or red, most were ovals of steel construction.



1 March 1881, Glasgow to Langholm, Scotland ½d stamp canceled with Glasgow Oval NP.B cancel. Glasgow alone used this oval cancel design.

½d rate for newspapers, stamped on paper, paper wrapper or commercial pre-printed wrapper.

GLASGOW OVAL NPB HANDSTAMP

Used to indicate a Mis-sending

Printed notice of meeting of London Missionary Society, sent London to Edinburgh 20 Oct 1881, missent to Glasgow



Notice was damaged in post and trapped in Glasgow-bound mail, sent forward "as is" by Glasgow NPB. Edinburgh struck their arrival mark on fold, to show that they received item in damaged condition
