

ONE CENT: DULL RED

The FOUR CENTS was produced by having the bottom inscription removed and the new value added. This leads to a white line, or traces of it, appearing above the value tablet and the lower corner figures. Subsequently, this white line was retouched with a line of colour appearing in its place. Later still, a printing was made with the figures in the corner framed.

In 1853, the Colony issued two imperforate stamps, the ONE CENT and the FOUR CENTS.

These values covered the newspaper rate (1c) and the inland letter rate (4c).

The stamps were printed by a lithographic process in London by Waterlow.
