


In June 1930 a flight of an experimental nature had been planned by the New York, Rio and Buenos Aires Airline (NYRBA) between Antigua and Montserrat, the aircraft to carry mail in each direction. The flight was due to leave Montserrat on 3 June and mail was prepared accordingly, although most of it seems to have been 'philatelic'. Owing to bad weather, however, the flight had to be postponed, and eventually was abandoned altogether. In February the following year, a seaplane from HMS Dorsetshire carried the waiting mail to St. Kitts. It bears a 'FIRST AIR MAIL' boxed cachet. The cover then went on to St. Lucia.



Another cover to St. Lucia bearing one of the St. Lucia provisional Postage Due stamps; backstamps show that it went via Dominica.

Two interesting examples of these issues being used in conjunction with Federal Leeward Islands Postal Stationery envelopes, both addressed to the USA.


