Adhesive Period 1840 - 1875

1855 Dublin Duplex 1873/78 Dublin/Newtownards Double

The *Duplex* handstamps were defined as those where neither the salient parts could be detached from each other on the handle. In mid April 1857 the *Double* handstamps were introduced where both were mounted on the same handle but could be separated.



1855 (December 18th) envelope showing a **penny red** tied by a Dublin **5/DE18/55/ 186** Duplex (first year of usage) struck twice.

1873 (May 27th) letter from Dublin to Spain showing a **6d chestnut Pl 11** tied by a *double* **DUBLIN/18/MY27/73** and a (four three four) bar diamond **186**.
