The Empire lost all of its lands in the Balkans. By 1912, the Bulgarian occupation of these lands was complete, and Bulgarian forces had come as far as Çatalca.





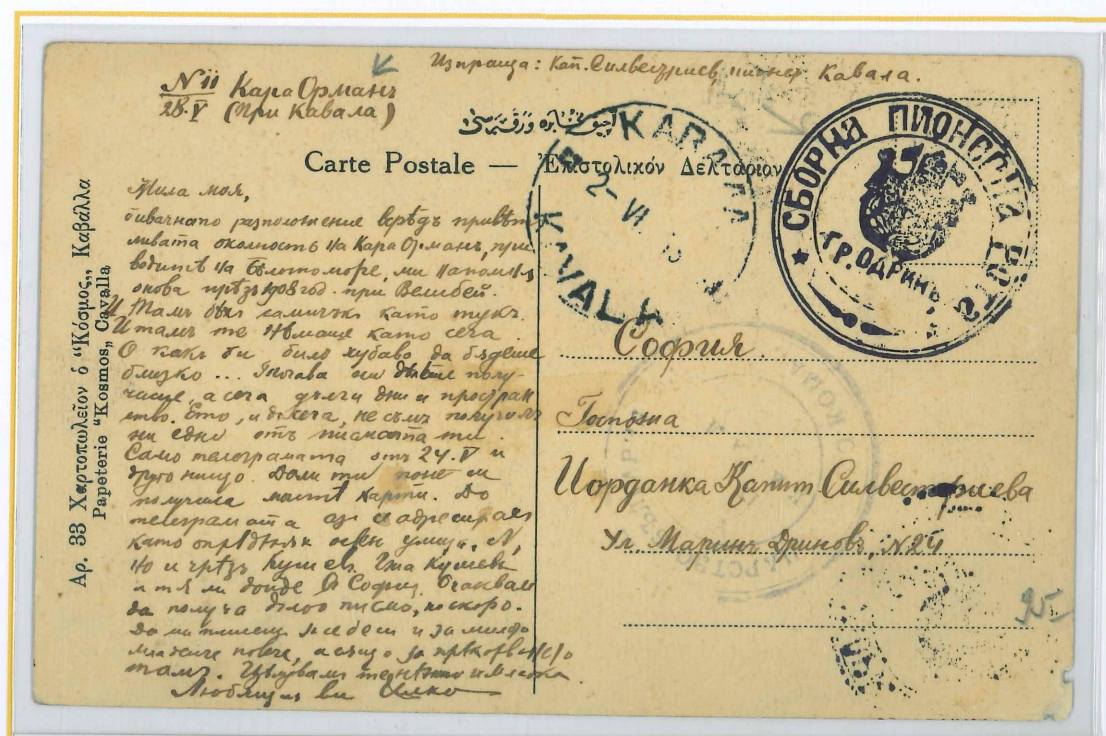

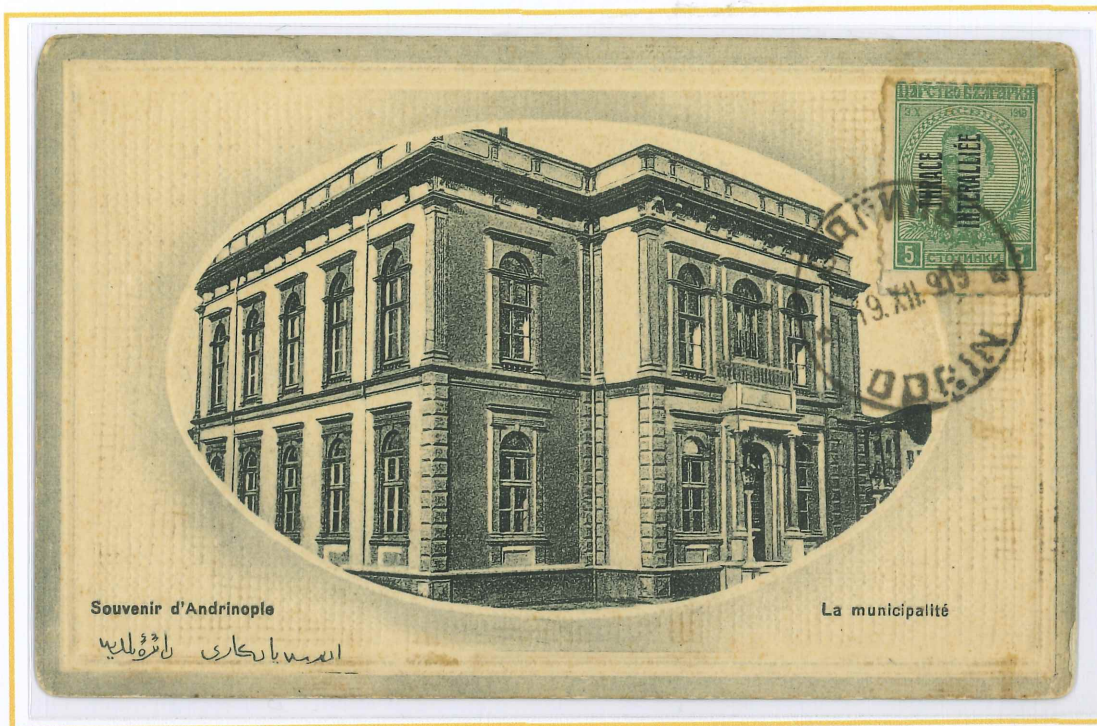

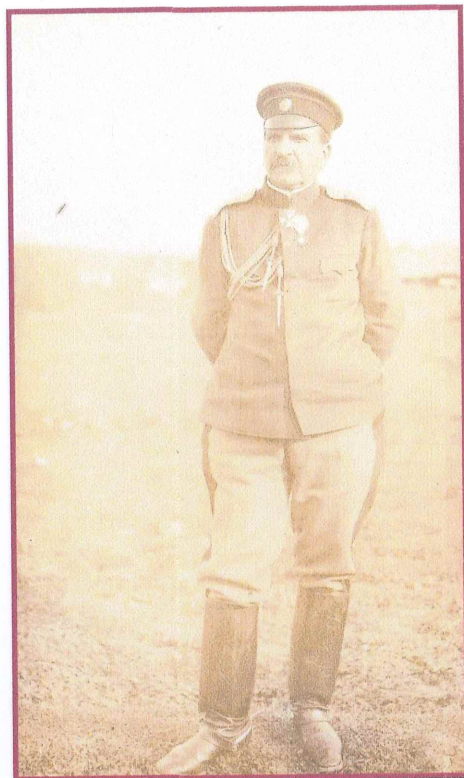

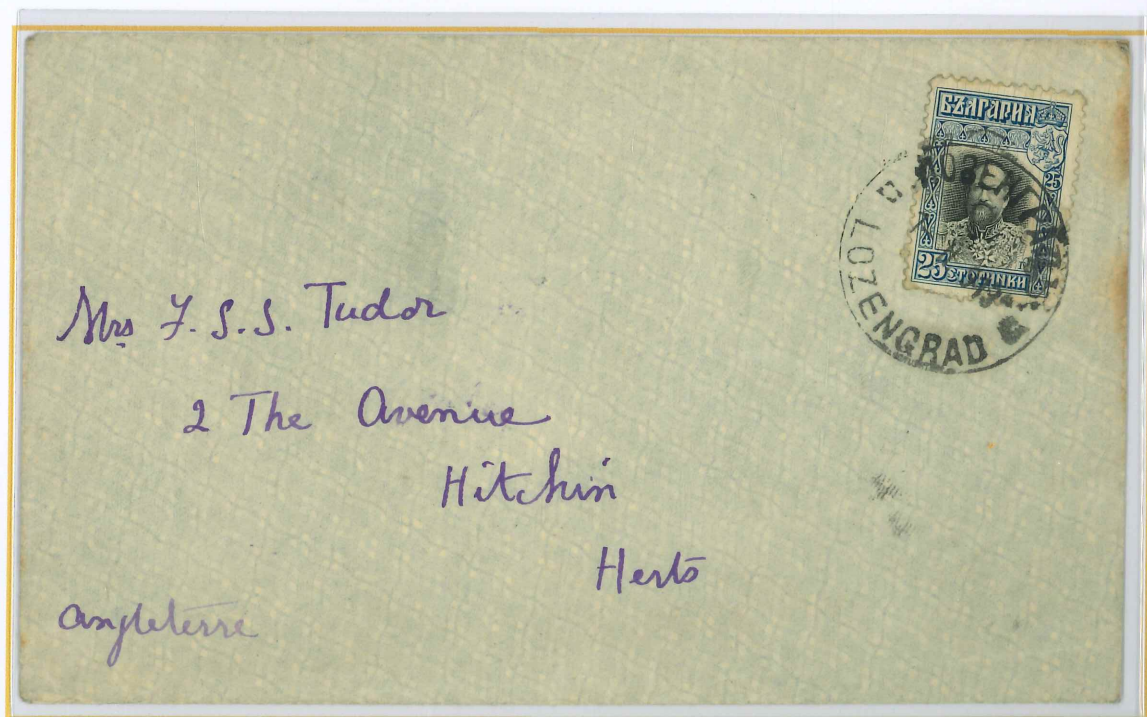

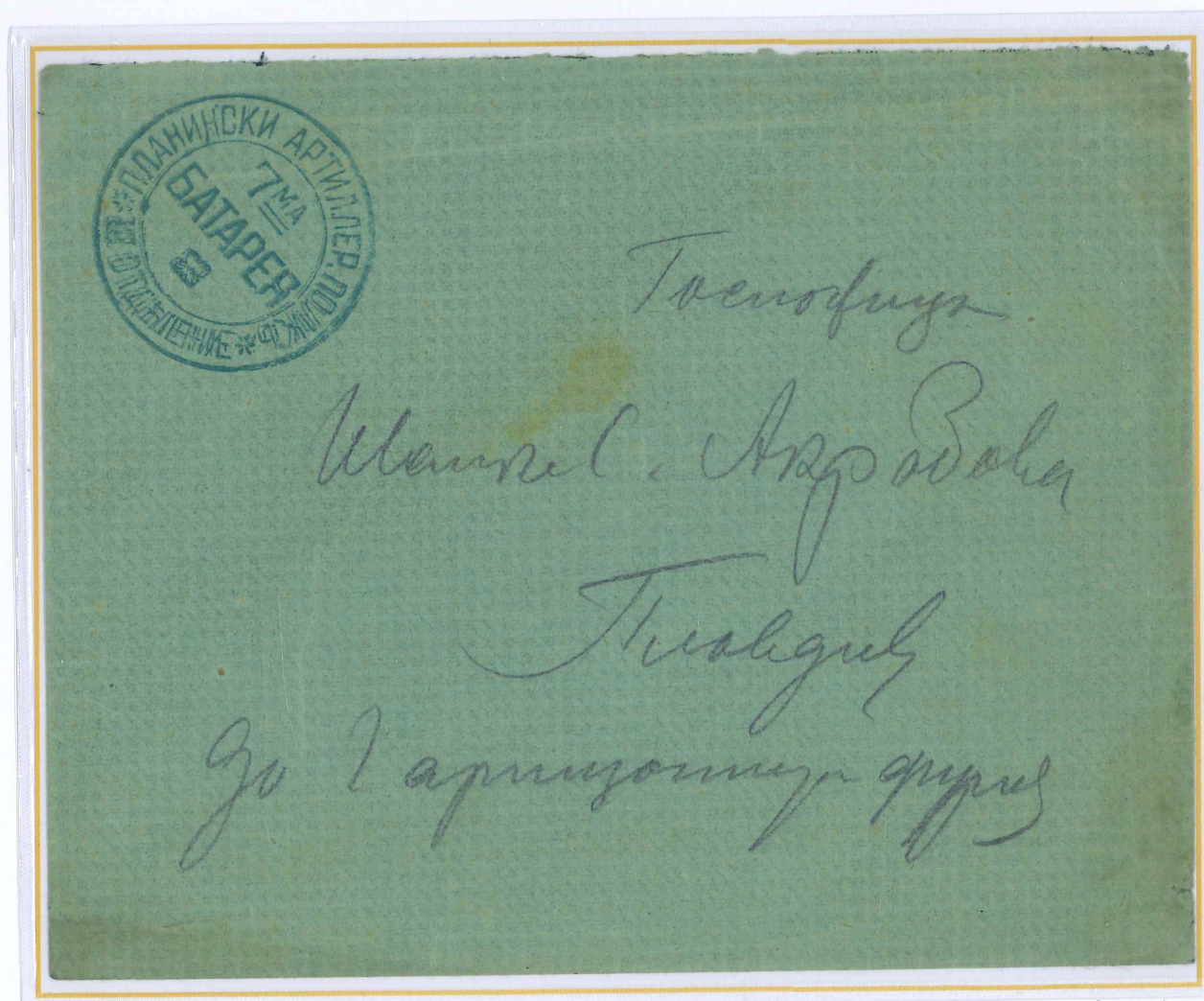

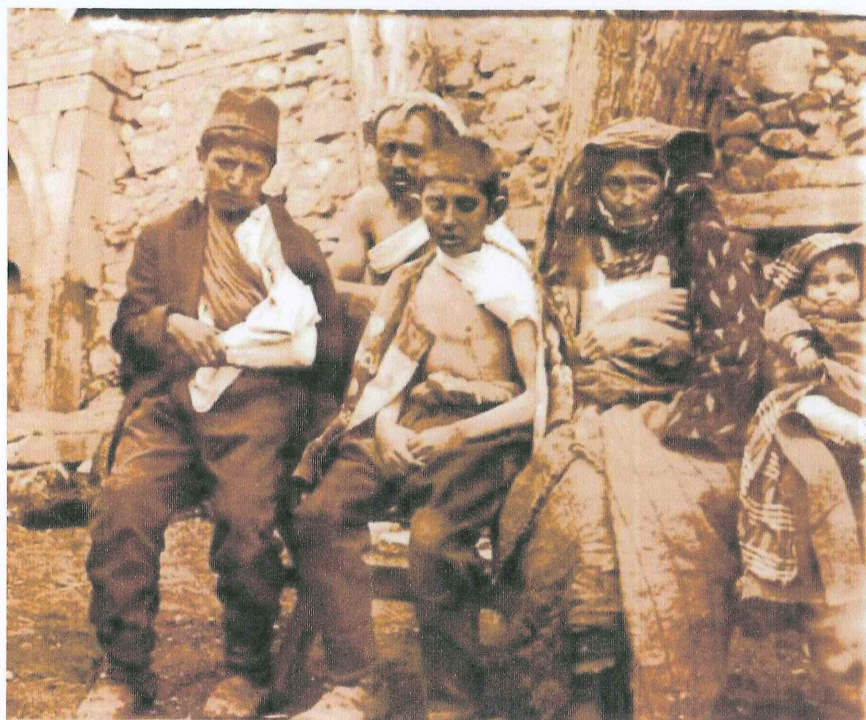
