







Plate 2 was produced in 1911





Key elements of a sheet printed from plate 2. Plate 2 was produced in 1907.

Union of South Africa

The Union was formed on 31 May 1910, but the first definitive postage stamps were only issued on 1 September 1913. In the interim, the stamps of the four former colonies were used across the entire Union.

The ½d and 1d stamps of the four former colonies were insufficient to last until the new Union stamps were issued. Consequently, new plates of the Transvaal ½d and 1d were made up as required, and stamps printed from these new plates were used to fill the gap until the issue of the new Union stamps on 1 Sepember 1913.













Plate blocks of the 1906-09 issue, with two shades of the ½d denomination.
