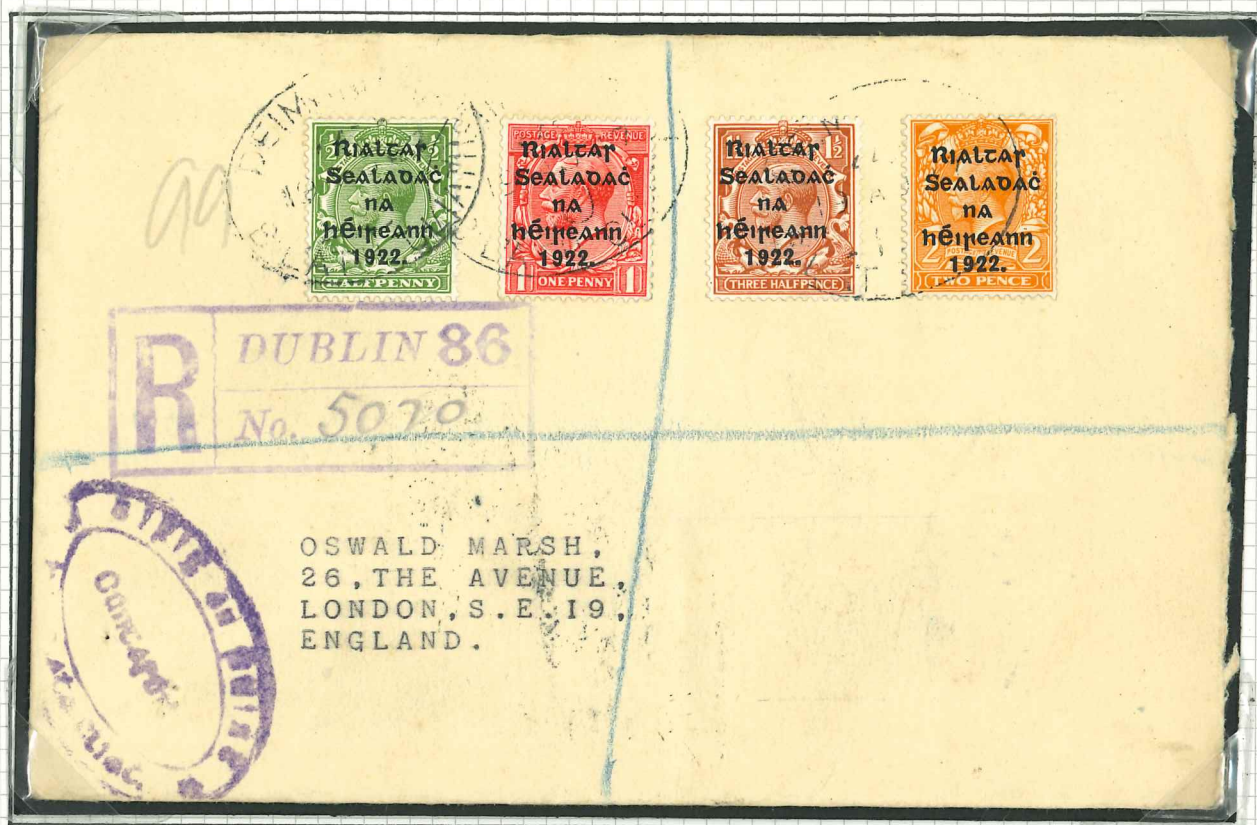
Harrison and Sons coil pairs on cover Dublin to London dated 21, DE 1922.



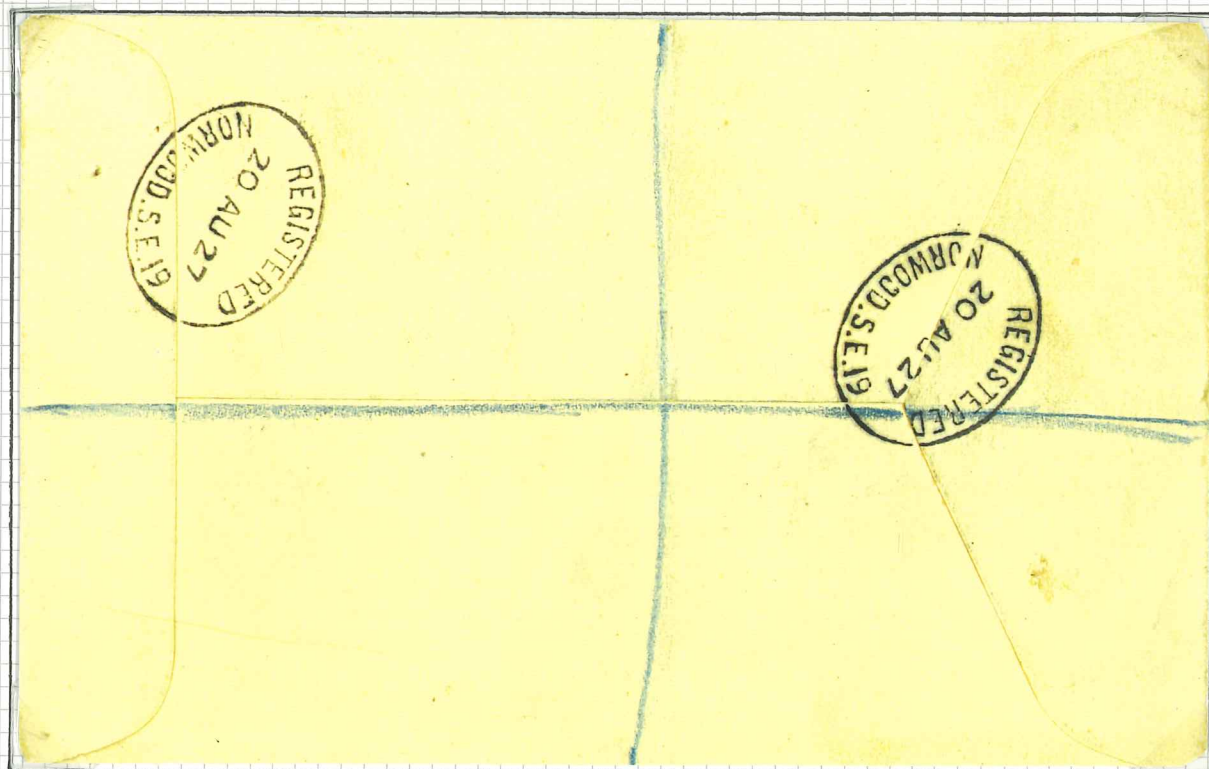
Harrison ½d and 1½d coils paid the inland letter rate, 14 October 1922.

IRELANDHarrison 5-line coils

1½d., brown strip of 3 with single ½d., making up the registered letter rate on cover to London filed DUBLIN 7 c.d.s. for 28.FE.24.

IRELAND - OVERPRINTS

Harrison 5-line coils:- ½d, 1d, 1½d and 2d die 1 paying correct 5d rate on 1927 registered cover to London with unusual hand struck R/DUBLIN 86 in violet and oval POST OFFICE cachet.

Harrison 5-line coils: 1/2d, 1d, 1 1/2d and 2d paying collect 5d rate on what would appear to be a registered cover, although no registration label has been applied.

Postmarked LOWER BAGGOT ST DUBLIN 25. JY. 22.

Addressed to J. Stafford Johnson, a distinguished philatelist of the period.

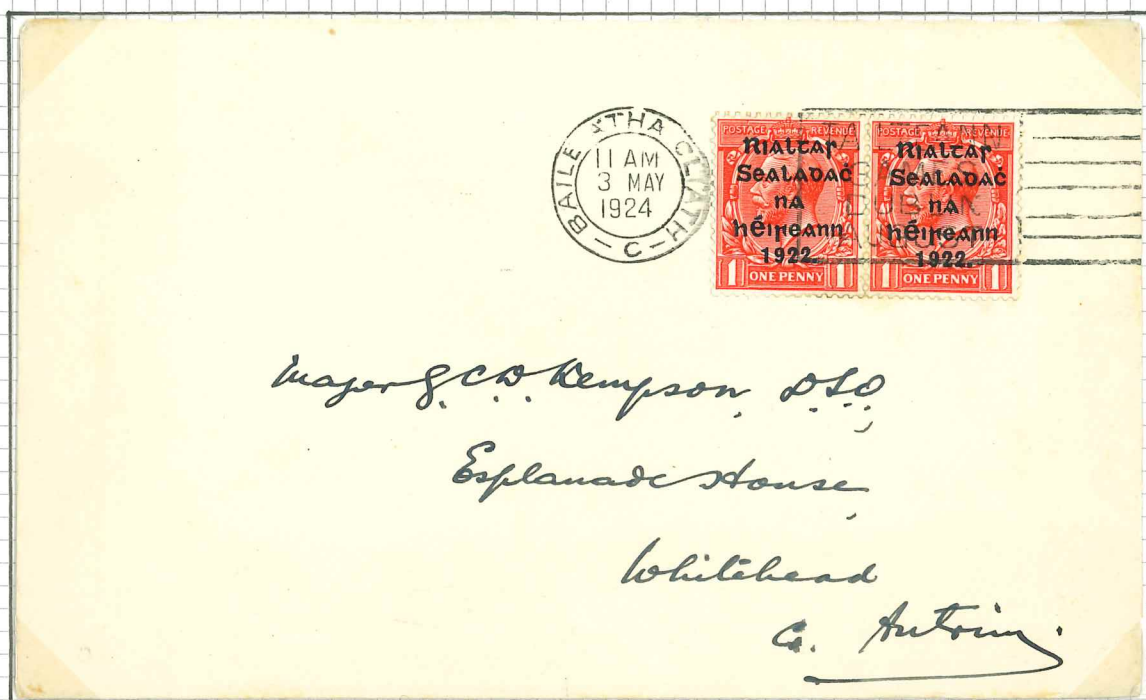

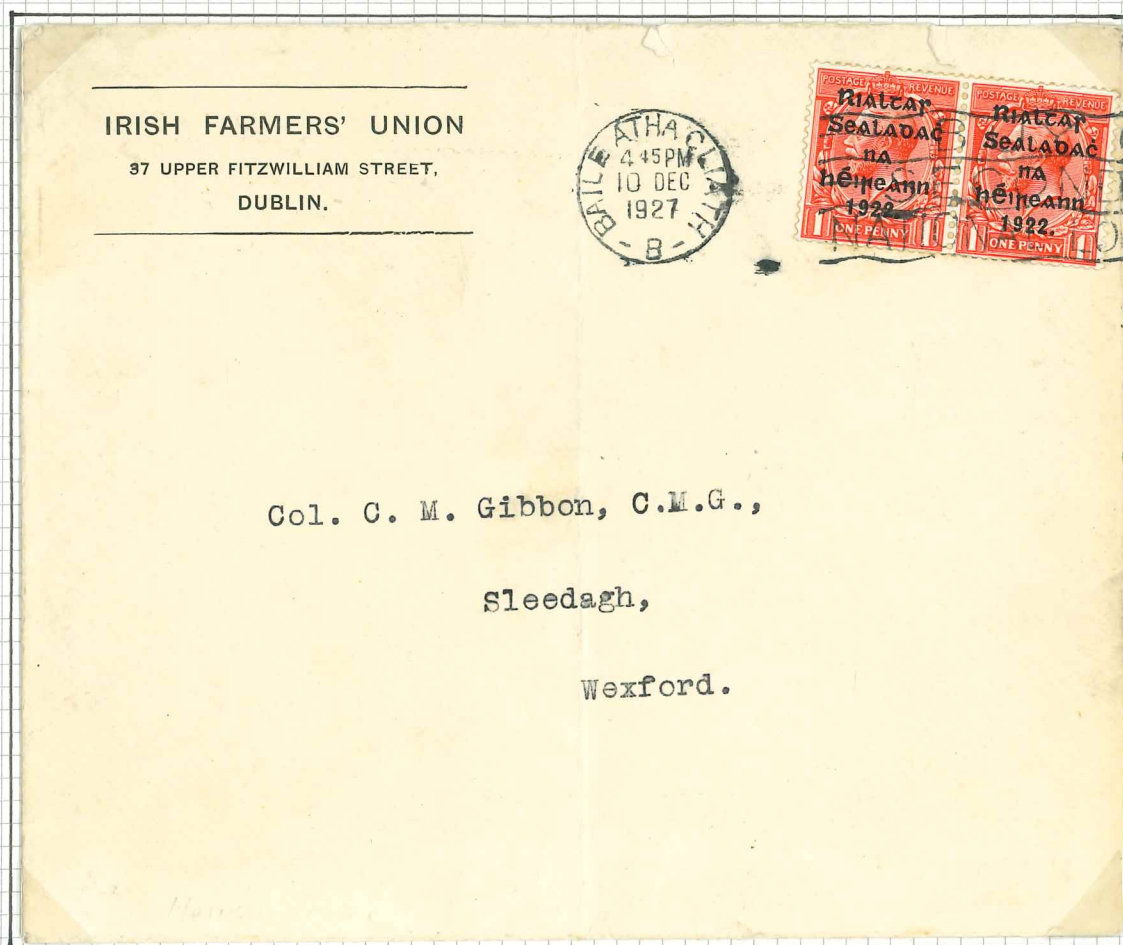
Pair of 1d reds on Cover Dublin to Sheffield tied RATHMINES DO. DUBLIN 4.

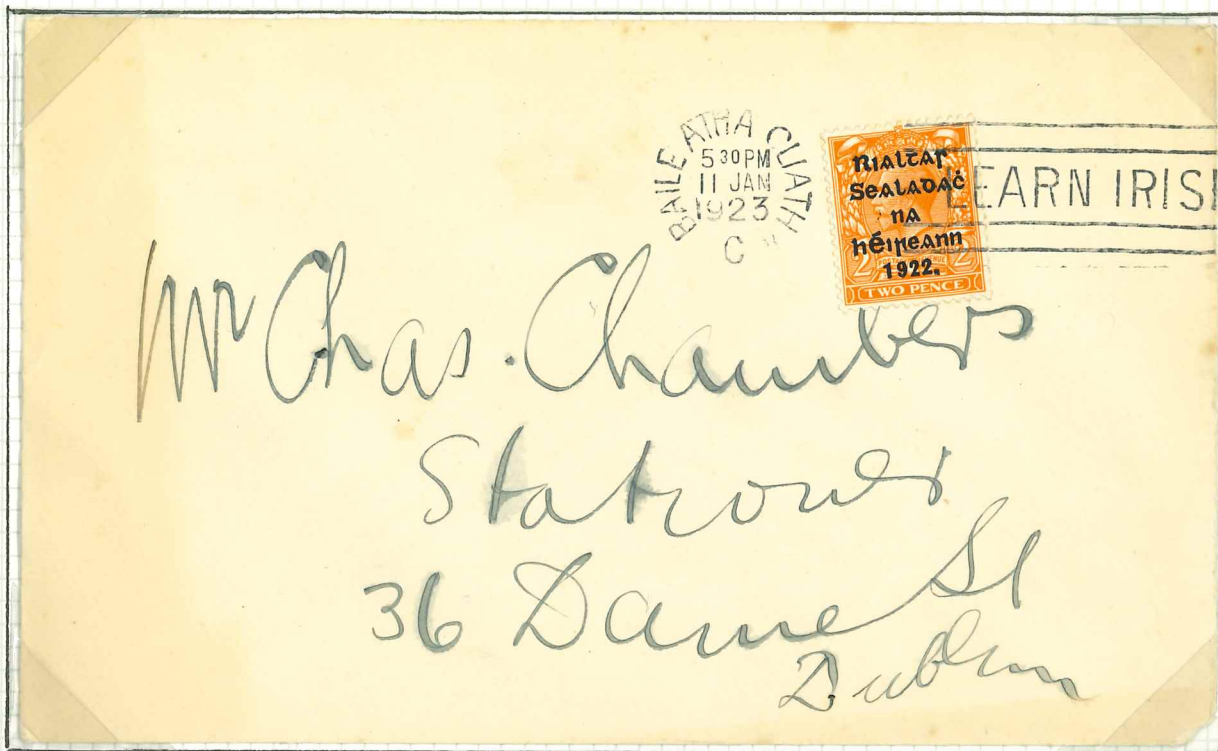

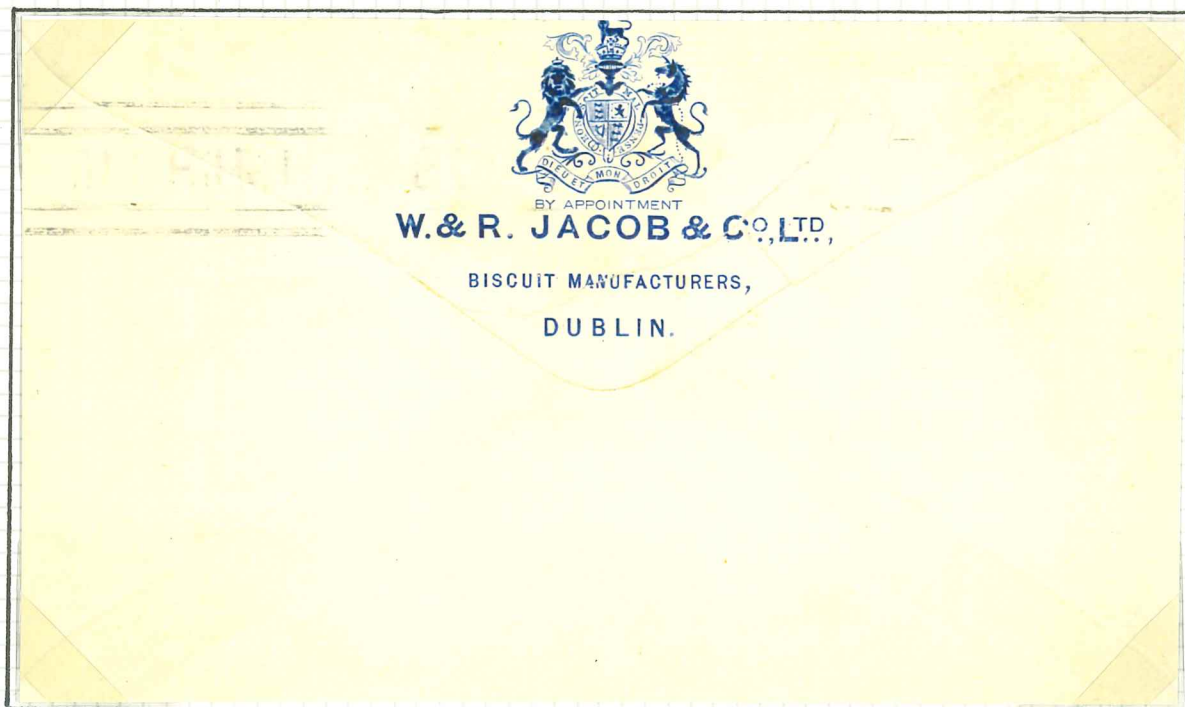

Universal Machine - Rimless Type.

Following the fire at the Rotunda Rink sorting office on Nov 5th 1922 which destroyed both the "Hey-Dolphin" machines (these machines had replaced the "Ktag" machines destroyed in the G.P.O. during 1916 rising) three "Ktag" machines were hurriedly resubjected as a temporary measure until January 1923 when five new "Universal" machines of the rimless type were brought into use. The above cover with a Dublin 11. Jan 1923 machine cancel represents a very early use of the new machines
