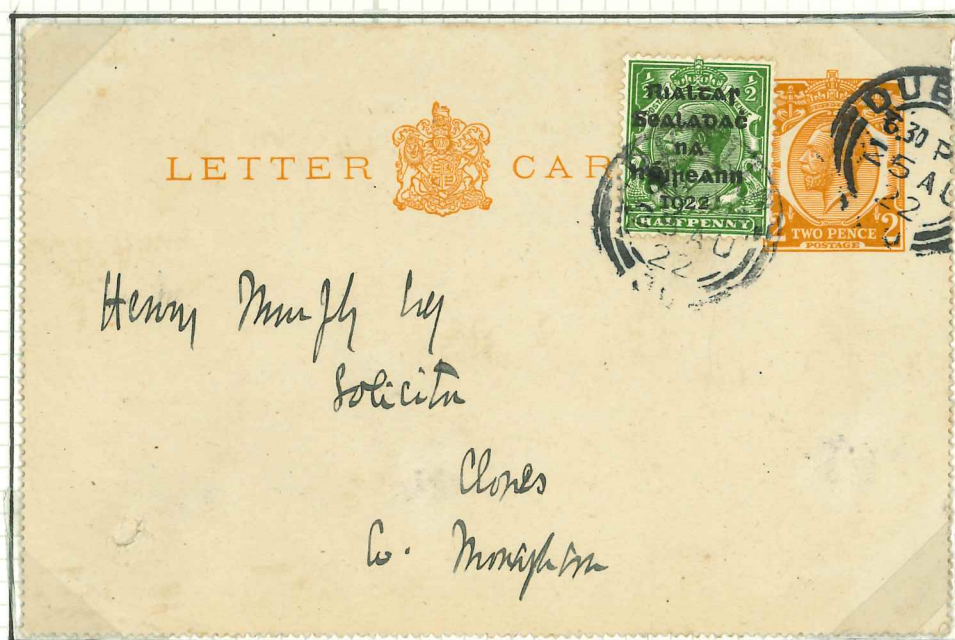


IRELAND
TRANSITIONAL PERIOD



1922 G.B. 2d orange letter-card posted from Dundalk to Dublin during the legal period; dated 13. No. 22.



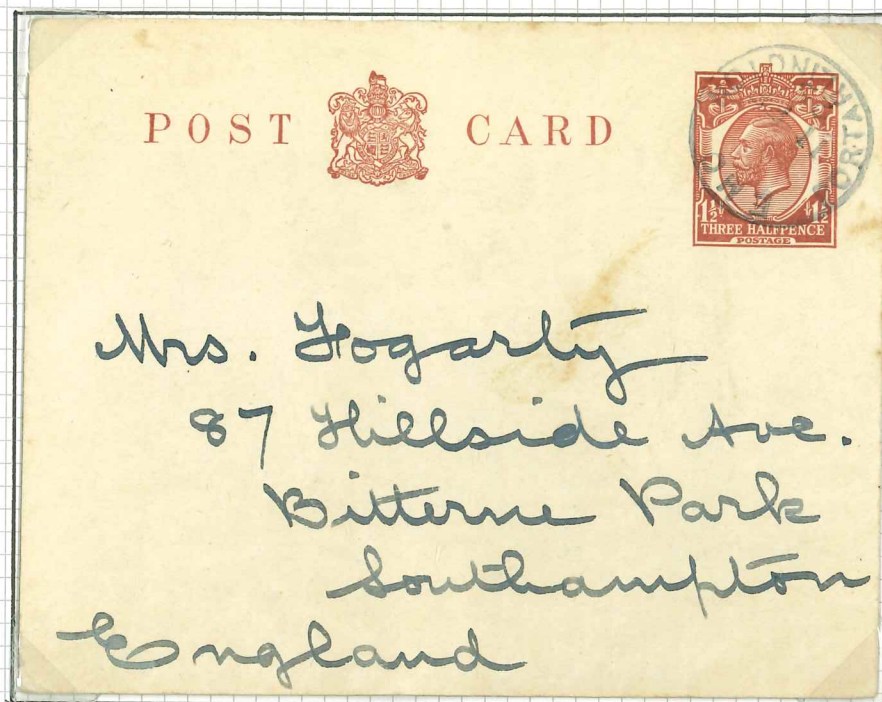
1922 G.B. 2d orange lettercard with Dollard 1/2d overprint tied Dublin 25. AU. 22. cds. Scarce legal combination of G.B. plus overprint.

TRANSITIONAL PERIOD.IRELANDPOSTAL STATIONERY.

G.B. 1½d brown letter-card uprated with ½d green Harrison coil stamp to the letter rate of 2d.

Legally used from Cork to London with Cork c.d.s. dated 28 FEB. 1923 and slogan post-mark "LEARN IRISH".

The British Postage rate was reduced to 1½d on 29 May, 1922, hence the 1½d brown letter card. The letter rate in Ireland remained at 2d. The Irish Post Office on 23 April 1922 stated that a G.B. letter-card could be uprated to 2d without surcharge.

TRANSITIONAL PERIODIRELANDPOSTAL STATIONERY

1925 G.B. 1½d brown ps. card to Southampton cancelled by temporary rubber EMO cds. for 11.FE.25 after the issue of Ireland's first postal stationery post-cards that being 13 September 1924. Allowed without surcharge.



Geo V 1½d brown postcard size "d" to Armagh cancelled by Cork "Hammerhead" bridge c.d.s. dated:- 25 SEP 23.

Co. Cork to Dublin, cancelled by temporary rubber
c.d.s. dated 24 JUN 22.

Universal machine cancel with slogan fitted
between the wavy lines.

TRANSITIONAL PERIODIRELANDPOSTAL STATIONERY

G.B. Geo V 1 1/2d brown post card, size "d" used from Waterford to London uprated with Geo V 1/2d green with Dollard overprint and cancelled WATERFORD 22. MR 22



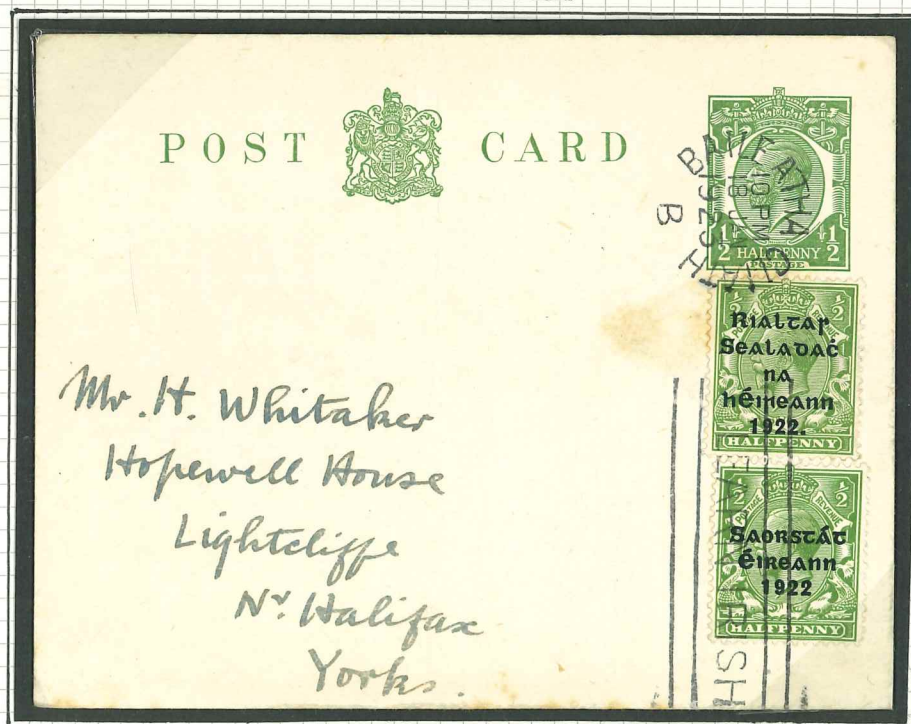
G.B. Geo V 1d red postcard, size "d" with Dollard 1d red used to Bandon (Co. Kerry), tied by Courtmacsherry c.d.s dated 28. AP. 22.

TRANSITIONAL PERIODIRELANDPOSTAL STATIONERY

Until August 1924, when the Irish Post Office issued their own postal stationery, that of Great Britain could be used quite legally throughout Ireland.



1916-17 "Mackennal Head" G.B. Geo V ½d green postcard to Yorkshire, England uprated with Thom 3-line overprint on 1d to make up postcard rate. Cancelled DUBLIN 18.JA.23.



As above to same destination but this time uprated to postcard rate with Thom ½d green, wide setting and Thom 3-line overprint ½d green. Dublin Universal machine cancel with slogan dated 18.JAN.23.

TRANSITIONAL PERIODIRELANDPOSTAL STATIONERY

1912 "Downey Head" 1/2d Geo V green postcard to Yorkshire updated with 1d red (Dollard overprint) to post-card rate of 1 1/2d. Canceled DUBLIN 8 c.d.s. dated 23. MR. 22



1916-17 "Mackennal Head" G.B. Geo V 1d red postcard to Halifax, England, updated with 1/2d green with 3-line overprint to postcard rate of 1 1/2d.

Canceled DUBLIN c.d.s. date unclear but appears to be 19. JA. 23.

clearly dated on reverse)
The overprint did not appear until 17 FEB 1922.

TRANSITIONAL PERIODIRELANDPOSTAL STATIONERY

1912 "Downey Head" G.B. 1d red foreign postcard to Halifax, England, updated with G.B. 1/2d green with 5 line overprint to postcard rate of 1/2d. Dublin machine cancel MAR 23 1922 and Dublin c.d.s. for 23. MR. 22.

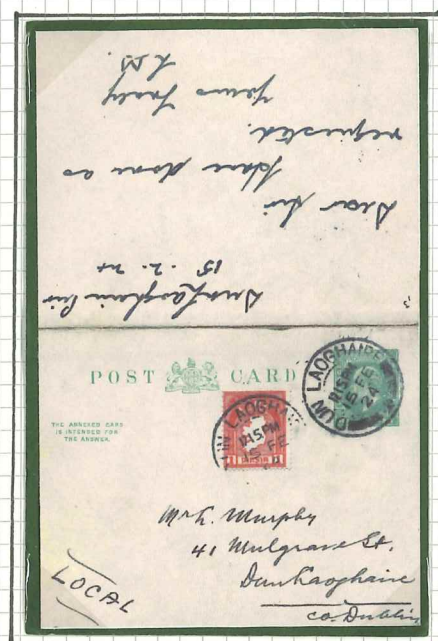


As above, to same destination but this time updated with G.B. 1/2d green with 3 line overprint to postcard rate of 1/2d. Cancelled with Gaelic BAILE ATHA CLIATH cds. 19. JAN. 23.

TRANSITIONAL PERIODIRELANDPOSTAL STATIONERY.

G.B. Edward VII 1/2d green postal stationery postcard
 used from DUBLIN to HALIFAX, YORKSHIRE uprated with
 Geo. V 1d red 3-line overprint to make up correct rate
 of 1 1/2d. Cancelled DUBLIN c.d.s. dated 19 JAN. 23.

Most unusual legal and late use of Edward VII postal
 stationery.

Transitional PeriodIRELANDPostal Stationeryoutward half

1924 (Feb) King Edward VII 1/2d + 1/2d green Reply card with linen strip uprated with "SE" wmk. 1d to the current rate of 1 1/2d with outward half cancelled double ring Dun Laoghaire d.s. 15.FE.24 and the return half cancelled with Dublin double ring d.s. 19.FE.24. Legal usage before the introduction of the 1 1/2d postcard later in 1924
