Genuine stamps of these series are perforated $10\frac{1}{2}$ and $12\frac{1}{2}$ also compound
Stamps gauging 11 are probably Fournier forgeries

In the novice denominations note especially the arabesques over
the right hand numeral.

In the drone denominations note the corner triangles (upper left
especially) and the numerous crudities in the central escutcheon.

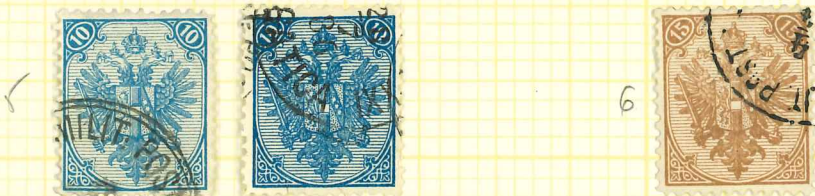
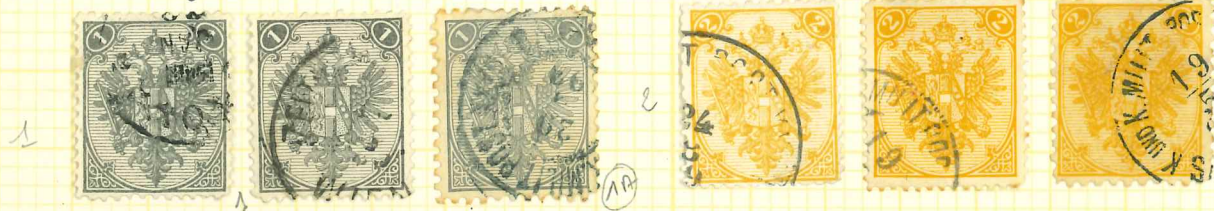

The one half novica Bosnia nr 1

The 1/2, though usually catalogued as Bosnia nr. 1 is not the first Bosnian adhesive, but was added to the 1879 series in 1894. All 1/2's have the general characteristics of the Type 2 stamps.

As Bosnia NO 1 it is lithographed; as no 1a it is typographed. In the lithographed stamps the dot between the ends of the curved ornaments at bottom right touches the right ornament. In the typographed stamp the dot stands clear.
